## Notes/Narratives

### NARRATIVE

#### Summary:

On 02/20/2016, at approximately 2208 hrs, I responded to 4102 Stadium Drive, Seelye Kia, for a homicide. Upon my arrival I observed the two victims, later IDed as Tyler Smith and his father, Richard Smith, lying in the parking lot suffering from several gunshot wounds. Both subjects were obviously deceased. No life saving measures were performed. I later checked out the videos of the surrounding dealerships, contacted Life EMS personnel who were on scene, and received a time of death. I also had contact with Daniels Removal Service, who took Tyler and Richard Smith from the scene. A suspect has been arrested in this case.

#### ARRIVAL:

Upon my arrival I could immediately observe a silver Range Rover parked in the parking lot with its headlights facing a blue Ford pick-up truck. Near the front of the Range Rover I observed two human bodies lying on the sidewalk with multiple gunshot wounds to each. I immediately exited my patrol car and checked the area for a potential shooter. Once I determined that the immediate area was clear I proceeded to the bodies and checked them for any signs of life. Both Tyler and Richard were deceased.

#### SCENE SECURITY:

After confirming that both Tyler and Richard were deceased I quickly went back to my patrol car and retrieved crime scene tape and began to mark off the surrounding area.

#### K9 TRACK:

PSO Brooks and his partner, K9 Bodi, arrived on scene and attempted a K9 track. Please see PSO Brooks' supplemental report for further information.

#### LIFE EMS:

Life EMS was called to the scene with Life EMS personnel Sara Morales and Christopher Fouch responding. Life EMS personnel ran a medical strip to check Tyler and Richard for any signs of life. Please see their medical reports for anything further.

#### TIME OF DEATH:

Tyler and Richard's time of death is 2223 hrs on 02/20/2016. They were pronounced deceased by Doctor Solven, Resident #1618.

#### CRIME LAB:

The KDPS Crime Lab responded to the scene and processed it. Please see their supplemental reports for further information.

#### MEDICAL EXAMINER:

Several members from the area medical examiner office responded to the scene as well. Please see Sgt. Boyer's supplemental report for further information.

#### CANVASS:

While all of this was occurring Sgt. Deblecourt and PSO Vandenberg performed a canvass. Please see their supplemental reports for further information.

#### SURVEILLANCE VIDEO:

After securing the scene with scene tape I was able to contact [REDACTED] via KDPS Dispatch and have him respond to his facility. [REDACTED] was able to successfully assist KDPS officers in retrieving video of this incident. I later responded to Zeigler Automotive across the street in an attempt to locate any video from their facility, however due to the new construction their video system is currently down. Please see PSO Behnen's supplemental report for further information on the video.

In the video you can see a white male exit a Chevy HHR. The white male appears to be approximately 40 years old, wearing a dark coat, blue jeans, and dark shoes. The HHR that the suspect was driving was possibly dark green or blue in color, however probably black.

#### ATTEMPTS TO LOCATE SUSPECT:

The KCSD located the suspect travelling in the downtown area of Kalamazoo. Please see their report for further information.

#### INTERVIEW WITH SUSPECT (JASON BRIAN DALTON):

#### BODY REMOVAL:

I stood by on scene as Daniels Removal Service removed Tyler and Richard from the scene. Staff members included Stephanie Daniels, Michael Daniels, and Patrick McDonald. Daniels Removal Service began removal at 0158 hrs and left the scene at 0204 hrs on 02/21/2016.

#### DISPOSITION:

I had no further involvement in this incident.

#### INFORMATION:

On 2/20/2015 at approximately 2208hrs I overheard KDPS radio traffic dispatch officers to 4102 Stadium at the Seelye KIA dealership in reference to a possible shooting. The reportee advised that two subjects had been shot and was not sure if they were breathing.

#### ARRIVAL:

While en route I overheard an officer advise that both subjects were deceased.

Upon my arrival I entered the parking lot from the west end of the dealership. Other officers were already on scene. I observed two white males lying on the ground in the dealership parking lot by the KIA sign in front of a silver Land Rover SUV.

#### OFFICER ACTIONS:

I was assigned the checked the dealership and parking lot for anymore victims.

I first checked the Seelye KIA dealership with Sgt Vanderklok. This building was secure.

I then checked the Seelye Ford (3820 Stadium Dr) dealership to the east of the scene. This building was also secure.

I then checked the parking lot of Seelye KIA for additional victims however located none.

#### SURVEILLANCE VIDEO:

██████████ Chief information officer for Seelye Auto Group, responded to the scene to assist in reviewing surveillance video. I reviewed the video with him.

2158hrs - Victims vehicle entered parking lot between Seelye Ford and KIA.

2201hrs - Suspect vehicle (black Chevrolet HHR) enters Seelye parking lot, drives towards Ford side (east), and comes back to the KIA side (west).

2203hrs - Victims looking at a pickup truck.

2204hrs - Suspect vehicle parks in front of Seelye dealership.

2205hrs - Suspect shoots victims.

Donohue secured a copy of the video (both Service Door and Main entrance) to my KDPS issued flash drive. I provided CID with a copy and placed a copy in the "Bombich Forensic Video" folder on the KDPS "K" drive.

#### CONTACT WITH SUSPECT (JASON DALTON):

I responded to the area of Ransom and Porter where a possible suspect had been taken into custody. Upon my arrival I observed the Chevrolet HHR stopped on the roadway. The vehicle matched that of the suspect vehicle I observed on the Seelye surveillance video.

I looked at the subject who was detained and he matched the physical and clothing description of the suspect I had observed in the video. I advised

other officers that this appeared to be the suspect in the Seelye KIA shooting. The suspect was wearing dark pants, a yellow t-shirt, black sweater, and a spring coat.

I removed the suspect, who was identified as Jason Dalton by his Michigan operator's license, from the KCSD cruiser and took custody of him.

#### SEARCH OF SUSPECT:

I searched Dalton's person incident to his arrest.

In his front left pant pocket I located a 9mm bullet. In his right coat pocket I located a small ripped piece of cardboard which appears to be a card associated with a shooting range.

While conducting a pat down of the suspect, I then noticed that he was wearing a bullet proof vest underneath his sweater.

#### TRANSPORT:

I transported Dalton to KDPS HQ to CID for an interview.

#### EVIDENCE:

I took custody of the bullet and the small piece of paper I had located on Dalton's person. I turned them over to PSO Lab Tech Neldon at 0256hrs at KDPS CID.

After his interview, I also took custody of Dalton's clothing. All items were also turned over to PSO Lab Tech Neldon at KDPS HQ.

#### ALCOHOL / DRUG USE:

I detected no signs of intoxication on Dalton. He also denied drinking. He blew a .00BAC at the KCSD Jail.

#### DVR:

1151 was saved as evidence.

#### BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

On Saturday 2-20-16 at 2240 hours I was called in to investigate a Homicide. Richard Eugene Smith and his son, Tyler Daniel Smith had been shot multiple times in the parking lot of Seelye Kia at 4102 Stadium Dr. Technicians Neldon, Thomas, and DenHarder also responded to analyze the scene. I measured and mapped the scene, and assisted the Forensic Pathologist with documenting the autopsies.

#### SCENE ENTRY:

I arrived at the scene at approximately 0000 hours. The scene was secured with crime scene tape and officers were posted on the perimeter. Technician Neldon was already processing the scene.

#### SCENE SEARCH/ANALYSIS:

Technician Neldon had already searched the core of the scene and marked evidence. I searched the car dealership parking lot directly across the street from the scene looking for other bullet impact sites, finding none.

#### SCENE DOCUMENTATION:

I documented the scene and the evidence items using the Total Station. I produced a scaled map of the scene, which is attached to this report.

#### DISPOSITION OF VEHICLE:

I cleared the scene at approximately 0230 hours. I drove the victim's Range Rover to KDPS Station 4/5 and secured it in the pole barn.

#### INFORMATION:

On 02/20/16, I responded to 4102 Stadium Dr (Seelye KIA) in the City of Kalamazoo reference two people that had been shot. The victims were later identified as Richard Smith Jr and Tyler Smith. They were deceased upon arrival. The caller, [REDACTED], was uninjured and still on scene upon arrival.

#### ARRIVAL/OFFICER ACTIONS:

I was the first officer on scene of this incident. I responded from the west on Stadium Dr and entered the parking lot of Seelye KIA. KDPS Dispatch advised the caller was in the parking lot in a gray Range Rover. I located the gray Range Rover (MI REG: DDZ 6522) on the north side of the property near the front row of vehicles closest to Stadium Dr. I could immediately see two white male subjects, later id'ed as Richard Smith Jr and Tyler Smith lying on the concrete of the parking lot close to the gray Range Rover. I could see that Richard and Tyler were not moving and apparently dead. I did not see anyone else around them. I exited my patrol vehicle and walked up to check on the victims and assess the scene. I saw numerous spent casings around the victims and the Range Rover on the concrete.

I then saw movement inside of the gray Range Rover. I then saw it was a female and she was on a cell phone in the backseat of the Range Rover. The female was later id'ed as [REDACTED] by other officers. [REDACTED] exited the vehicle through the drivers side door. Note that I may have touched the door as she was getting out. I immediately asked [REDACTED] where the suspect was. She pointed behind at the Seelye KIA building to the south and said he went that way. I then went to check on the two victims, Richard and Tyler. I checked the pulse of Richard and had another officers check for any life of Tyler. I had no pulse from Richard. At this point numerous other officers were arriving on scene and assignments had commenced.

#### SCENE:

I was assigned by shift commander to handle the scene.

I assigned officers to secure the scene with police tape.

I assigned PSO's Leonard and Wright as scene security for a portion of this incident.

I assigned PSO's Behnen, Sgt. DeBlecourt to assist with canvassing the area for victims around the dealership.

Sgt VanderKlok assisted with searching around the dealership.

A secondary search was assigned to make sure no other victims were located. No other victims located around the dealerships.

While I was on scene I assisted with scene security ensuring no one tampered with the bodies or entered into the crime scene. I stayed on scene doing scene security while the Crime Lab processed until PSO's Wright and Leonard relieved me.

#### MEDICAL EXAMINER:

I requested shift commander to contact the Medical Examiner and have them respond to the scene. Both Jim Matteson and Ken Rourke responded to the scene.

#### SUMMARY:

On February 20, 2016 I responded to the area of 4102 Stadium Drive (Seelye Ford KIA) for the report of two people being shot and them lying on the ground. Upon arrival K9 Bodi and I conducted a track for the shooter. After a short track, that did not leave the immediate area, the perimeter was pulled and we were returning to our vehicle. Kalamazoo County then reported shots fired and people being shot at the Cracker Barrel restaurant. I responded out to that scene as well and assisted. After leaving Cracker Barrel I responded back to the city of Kalamazoo and was conducting routine patrol when Kalamazoo County Deputy located the suspect vehicle. I assisted KCSD with the Felony stop of the vehicle and the apprehension of the suspect. After the suspect was in custody I photographed the suspect vehicle and the suspect's weapon that was located on his person and placed on the top of the vehicle.

#### SCENE:

The scene of the first incident was 4102 Stadium Dr. The second scene was Cracker Barrel 5581 S. 9th St. The third scene was the 400 block of E. Ransom near Walbridge.

#### INFORMATION:

K9 Bodi and I have been assigned to the Kalamazoo Department of Public Safety Canine team since October 2011. K9 Bodi is certified by the Kalamazoo Department of Public Safety, The USPCA, and NAPCH in tracking. K9 Bodi was last certified in October 2015 for tracking. I have been a Public Safety Officer for over 12 years. I have been a relief lab technician for over 10 years. In my years as a relief lab technician I have assisted in and processed several thousand crime scene to include homicide scenes.

#### ARRIVAL TO 1ST SCENE:

Upon my arrival the beginning stage of the investigation was taking place. K9 Bodi and I attempted a track from the scene to see if it went anywhere. The track did not lead away from the scene. It was then learned that the suspect had fled in a vehicle.

#### ARRIVAL TO 2ND SCENE:

I was the second person on the scene and I observed a red car and minivan sitting next to each other in the parking lot. The first arriving unit, MSP, was attempting to look into the victim's vehicle. We then began to try and perform life saving procedures on the victims in the two different vehicles. As the paramedics were attending to the victims I then began to secure the scene. I located several shell casings around the victim's vehicles and I marked them. After the scene was secured I then left and responded back to the city.

#### ARRIVAL TO 3RD SCENE:

KCSD deputy advised he was behind a vehicle matching the suspect vehicle on N. Pitcher crossing Kalamazoo St. I responded to the area to assist in the Felony stop of the vehicle. As I arrived Deputy Harrison and Sgt. Miller were giving commands to the suspect. The three of us approached the vehicle and as Harrison was placing the suspect, Jason Dalton, in custody I covered him.

#### PROCESSING OF SUSPECT VEHICLE:

As Dalton was being detained a loaded 9mm handgun was located in his waistband. The handgun was placed on the roof of Dalton's vehicle.

#### INTERVIEW WITH WITNESS:

#### SCENE OF SUSPECT ARREST:

Det. Pittelkow and I road together and went to the location of the suspect's arrest, E. Ransom and Porter St. in the City of Kalamazoo. We heard over the police radio that officers had spotted the possible suspect's vehicle and had made a traffic stop on the vehicle.

Once we arrived the vehicle that was stopped by officers did appear to match that of the suspect's vehicle from the surveillance video.

Also when we arrived officers had secured the suspect, who was later identified as Jason Dalton. They had also located a handgun on Dalton and seized this weapon.

I had dispatch run the gun, a 9mm Walther Serial # 016443. The gun did come back to Jason Dalton.

#### DEATH NOTIFICATION:

Det. Pittelkow and I then went to [REDACTED] to deliver a death notice to the wife and daughter of the victim's from the Seelye shooting. On arrival at this location we met with Portage PD and EMS who were already on scene. We had [REDACTED] and her daughter [REDACTED] go inside and we delivered the death notice.

#### SEARCH WARRANT:

Det. Pittelkow, Det. Goodell and I then went to 7031 Douglas Ave., in Kalamazoo County, and assisted in a search warrant at the suspect's house. On 2-21-2016 I learned that [REDACTED] had posted something on Face Book warning other people about an UBER Driver, later identified from his photo posted on Face Book as Jason Dalton.

On 2-21-2016 I called [REDACTED] and she put me on the phone with her Fianc, [REDACTED] who actually had the information about Dalton.

[REDACTED]

[REDACTED] stated that he got an UBER ride from his address to [REDACTED] at about 1630hrs. on 2-20-2016. [REDACTED] stated that the driver had a photo from the UBER app and that is what was posted on Face book as a warning. This picture does appear to Dalton. [REDACTED] stated that while he was in the silver Chevy Equinox, the driver who stated his name was "Minnie" or something like that, got a call from a male subject, who's name might have started with a "C", on his blue tooth. After the phone conversation was over, the driver became upset and started driving very fast and erratic. Mellen stated that the driver ran the stop sign in front of Henderson Castle turning on to W. Main and side swiped a Ford Taurus. The driver then accelerated to a high rate of speed W/B W. Main, weaving in and out of traffic. [REDACTED] stated that the driver then went into the grass area at Nichols and W. Main and eventually came to a stop and this is when [REDACTED] jumped out. [REDACTED] stated that he was pleading with the driver to stop/slow down but he would not. [REDACTED] stated that he called 911 and gave the plate number of the UBER driver to the dispatcher, but he does not remember the plate number any longer. [REDACTED] stated he was very scared of the way the UBER driver was driving.

#### ADDITIONAL:

Once the car dealership parking lot was cleared, PSO Vandenberg and I went across the street to the Ziegler car dealership to check if there was any evidence in this parking lot or any other victims. We did not locate any evidence or any other victims.

#### AREA SEARCH:

PSO Vandenberg and I completed a search to make sure there were no other victims in the area. We began our search on Stadium Dr, just west of the crime scene. We checked parking lots, business and apartment complexes.

This search was done all the way down Stadium Dr to 9th St. We then continued this search south bound on 9th St to I-94. We did not locate any other victims of this crime spree.

#### Summary:

This supplemental report details the evidence collection and processing pertaining to the mass shooting events which transpired on 02/20/16; this report specifically details the work associated with KDPS 16-2433. Additional supplemental evidence reports have also been filed under KCSD 16-1707.

#### Narrative:

On Sunday 02/21/16 at approximately 0115 hours, I was contacted by D/Sgt Sparrow and asked to return to KDPS headquarters to photograph and obtain a gun shot residue (GSR) sample from Jason Dalton who had recently been taken into custody. At approximately 0130 I donned nitrile gloves and procured four samples from the hands of Dalton using SEM stubs from an RJ Lee GSR kit. I then photographed Dalton. Upon exiting the interview room Lt. Ostrander handed me a blue Point Blank ballistic vest that he indicated had been worn by Dalton when he was taken into custody. I then transported the GSR kit and vest to the crime lab where they were secured pending packaging and entry into the Q-Tel evidence system.

Lt. Ostrander then requested that I respond to Ransom street between Pitcher and Porter to photograph and retrieve evidence from the Chevrolet

HHR that Dalton was driving when he was taken into custody. At approximately 0155 I made contact with PSO Brooks at that location, Brooks pointed out to me several items on the roof of the HHR which he indicated had been removed from Daltons person.

These items were:

1. Walther P-99 9mm Pistol (S/N 016443)
2. Boker folding knife
3. Two J C Penny receipts

I took custody of those items and photographed them at the rear of my vehicle. It should be noted that prior to photographing the pistol I rendered it safe by removing the magazine and clearing the chamber, I noted that there was a live cartridge in the chamber and the magazine was fully loaded to its 15 round capacity.

At approximately 0600 the pistol and magazine with ammunition were then packaged as two separate items and turned over to D/Sgt. Petersen to be transported to the Michigan State Police Crime Lab for analysis.

At approximately 0700 Lt. Ostrander requested that I travel to KDPS Station 4/5 to process the HHR which had been secured at that location. At 0735 I conducted a search of that vehicle under the auspices of a search warrant from the 8th District Court produced by Lt. Ostrander and signed by the Honorable Judge Kropf.

The vehicle was identified as a 2007 Chevrolet HHR, 4 door, black in color. Michigan license plate "0JK H34" was affixed to the rear of the vehicle, the VIN was 3GNDA23D37S530661. The vehicle had a uniform layer of salt and road grime covering the exterior, no damage was noted and the exterior of the vehicle was in otherwise unremarkable condition.

A search of the interior of the vehicle revealed that the keys were in the ignition, when switched to the "on" position the odometer reading was 141108, there was approximately tank of gas, the radio was on and tuned to 103.3. I located the Michigan Registration in the glove box of the vehicle which identified the owner(s) as [REDACTED] with an address of [REDACTED]

I observed three Styrofoam cups in the drink holders (two in the front and one in the back) each containing liquid (apparently soda) but no ice. A thorough search of the vehicle revealed normal items which appeared to belong to the owners. These items were laid out on clean butcher paper and photographed for inventory purposes.

One item was located which did not appear to belong to the owners. Under the front passenger seat I located a receipt from the [REDACTED] [REDACTED]. This receipt was dated 02/20/16 at 6:49pm. The receipt indicated a withdraw of \$300.00 from the savings account using card [REDACTED] leaving a balance of \$1595.50. It should be noted that this was approximately one hour after the shooting event which occurred at [REDACTED] (KCSO 16-1707).

The above listed receipt was the only item seized from this vehicle. A signed a copy of the search warrant and carbon copy of the tabulation enumerating this single item were left in the vehicle. A second copy of the signed warrant and the original copy of the tabulation were turned over to Lt. Ostrander to be filed with the 8th District Court. The receipt was transported back to the crime lab and secured in room 434 pending packaging and entry into the Q-Tel evidence system.

On Wednesday 2/24/16 at about 1120 I retrieved item number 422 (KDPS128829) from the KDPS evidence room. This item consisted of separately packaged clothing items worn by Jason Dalton when he was taken into custody. I used two separate R J Lee GSR kits to obtain samples from Dalton's clothing. The first kit consisted of six SEM stubs to procure samples from Dalton's sweater and two samples from the front of his blue jeans. The second kit was used to obtain four samples from Daltons Jacket. The clothing items were repackaged and returned to the evidence room. The kits were packaged as separate evidence items and logged into the Q-Tel evidence system.

On 02-22-16, I was asked to assist Detective Rivard in contacting the Uber passengers who had ridden in Dalton's car in the hours leading up to the shootings. Below are those contacts.

#### CONTACT WITH [REDACTED]

I spoke with [REDACTED] about this matter on 02-22-16 at approximately 1320 hours in the lobby of [REDACTED], while Detective Rivard spoke to his friend, [REDACTED]. It was previously explained to [REDACTED] why we needed to speak with him and I asked him how it was he came into contact with Mr. Dalton. [REDACTED] that he was at a fraternity house on Fraternity Village Drive with [REDACTED] and another friend name [REDACTED] when [REDACTED] called for an Uber ride to take them back to [REDACTED] dorm at Valley 1. [REDACTED] said that he thought it was pretty late Friday night into Saturday morning, around 0100 or 0200. [REDACTED] stated that the driver (Dalton) didn't know where Valley 1 was and he thought this to be odd, as all Uber drives know where the Valley Dorms are. Hess said that [REDACTED] directed Dalton to Valley 1 and then they were dropped off without incident. I asked [REDACTED] if he is a frequent Uber ride and he stated yes. [REDACTED] said that was pretty much it and that the Dalton didn't really talk much. I asked [REDACTED] if he had seen a gun or ammunition or anything unusual while in the car and he said no. I asked if he recalled what kind of vehicle it was and [REDACTED] stated that it was a silver Chevy Traverse. I asked if he had ever seen Dalton before that night and he said no. I asked if he could think of anything else I should know and he said no. I gathered [REDACTED] personal information and this concluded our contact.

#### CONTACT WITH [REDACTED]

I called and left a message for [REDACTED] on 02-22-16 at approximately 1240 hours. [REDACTED] called me back later that afternoon at 1440 hours. [REDACTED] advised that he was at work and that he worked for Stryker Monday through Friday during normal business hours. It was arranged to meet during [REDACTED] lunch hour the following day, 02-23-16 at 1200 hours. On 02-23-16 at approximately 1205 hours, I interviewed [REDACTED] in a private conference room located at Stryker at 6300 S Sprinkle Road. [REDACTED] advised that he had been at his friend's condo, which is located off of Farmer's Alley. He stated that he requested an Uber cab and was picked up not long after requesting it at 0345 hours. [REDACTED] stated that he got into the front seat and the driver (Dalton) was alone. He said he gave him the address of another friend's house he was going to on Dorchester Ave in Milwood and then Dalton logged that address into his phone's GPS and they left. [REDACTED] stated that he recalled they talked about the downtown Kalamazoo area and how it was getting better. [REDACTED] said that Dalton mentioned that he lived in the downtown area. He couldn't recall if Dalton initiated conversation or if he did, as [REDACTED] will generally try to talk with people instead of having awkward silence. [REDACTED] didn't recall anything unusual about that ride. He said that after they turned onto Dorchester, he did recall that Dalton ran through a stop sign without stopping, but didn't think too much about it. He said he did feel like the ride went pretty fast. [REDACTED] that Dalton was driving a whitish colored HHR or Chevy type vehicle. He said it was fairly clean inside. [REDACTED] never saw a gun or anything that would have given him reason for concern. It wasn't until he heard about the shootings and saw a picture of Dalton on the news that he realized he had been one of Dalton's customers the day before. [REDACTED] had never seen him before that night. [REDACTED] had an email receipt of his transaction and I asked him to forward it to me so we could better piece together our timeline of Dalton's activities in the days and hours leading up to the shootings. [REDACTED] complained and the email is attached to this report.

#### CONTACT WITH [REDACTED]

I called and left a message for [REDACTED] at [REDACTED] on 02-22-16 at 1243 hours. On 02-23-16, I had not yet heard back from [REDACTED], so I prepared an email and sent to him at [REDACTED]. I requested that he call me about an Uber ride he had taken. At 1415 hours, I had a call back from [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] started by saying he did not want his name in the media. I explained his concern but advised that it was important for us to speak with anyone who had contact with Dalton in the days and hours leading up to the shooting. I said he knew he had been in Dalton's car and wanted to speak to him about that. [REDACTED] advised that he was currently in Atlanta, GA, where he resides and works and was just in Kalamazoo for business, therefore we spoke over the phone. [REDACTED] advised that he had requested an Uber cab on Friday night (into Saturday morning). Upon checking his receipt, he said he was picked up at

0337 hours and was dropped off in the Bell's Brewery parking lot at 0339 hours. [REDACTED] said that it took about 10 minutes for Dalton to pick him up and that Dalton was alone and was driving the Equinox. He said that he is a frequent Uber customer and that he did not think anything unusual or suspicious about Dalton. He said Dalton was very nice and even offered to wait while he [REDACTED] started his car in the Bell's lot. [REDACTED] told him that was OK and he said that [REDACTED] then left without incident. [REDACTED] described it as a normal Uber interaction. He said Dalton did seem a little tired, but that it was late after all. He did not see a gun or anything that would have caused him concern.

[REDACTED] would not provide me with his full name, DOB or address. He again reiterated that he did not want to be in the media, however stated he would be available via telephone at [REDACTED]. This concluded our contact.

#### CONTACT WITH [REDACTED]

I called and left a message for [REDACTED] at [REDACTED] on 02-22-16 at 1244 hours. On 02-23-16, I had not yet received a call back from [REDACTED] so I emailed him a message asking he call me to [REDACTED]. On 02-24-16 at approximately 1605 hours, I sent [REDACTED] a second email, advising him that I would like to meet with him tomorrow to obtain his statement. [REDACTED] has responded to several emails, however will still not commit to a time to meet. [REDACTED] advised in his last email that it was his friend [REDACTED] who ordered the Uber cab and not him, however admitted to being in the car with his friend. Further attempts will be made to contact [REDACTED] for a statement.

This concludes my involvement at this time.

#### INFORMATION:

On 2/20/16, I was contacted at home by Ex. Lt. Ostrander who asked if I could respond into work as officers were investigating multiple murders in the Greater Kalamazoo area. I responded into work and learned that there were a total of (3) shootings that had occurred on 2/20/16 and in the first incident, a female had been shot near Sprinkle / G Ave. and that female had suffered non-life threatening injuries and then hours later (2) people had been shot and killed in the parking lot of Don Seelye Ford on Stadium Dr. and approximately 10 minutes later, (4) people had been shot and killed at the Cracker Barrel off of 9th St. in Texas Township. I learned from officers that it appeared that a w/m subject, who was reported to be driving a blue or dark blue colored Chevrolet HHR had randomly shot these people. The initial information was that the (2) persons who had been shot on Stadium Dr. had died along with (4) of the persons who had been shot at the Cracker Barrel. We would later learn that a fifth person who had been shot at the Cracker Barrel also died of their injuries.

Detective Moorian and I were informed that a briefing was going to be held at KVCC in Texas Township and as we were preparing to leave to go to that location we overheard police radio traffic that officers had located a black colored Chevrolet HHR near the Downtown Kalamazoo area and were going to be making a traffic stop on the vehicle. After a few minutes had passed, Detectives learned that the lone occupant of the Chevrolet HHR matched the description of the suspect provided by witnesses to the shootings and we were also informed that this subject was armed with a handgun and was wearing a bulletproof vest when he was arrested out of the vehicle. Detective Moorian and I then stood by in the front lobby of KDPS as officers were transporting the suspect to KDPS. Once PSO Behnen arrived at KDPS with the suspect, Detective Moorian and I walked with the suspect into KDPS and we escorted him to an interview room in the KDPS CID. I did learn that this subject had been identified as Jason Dalton by his Michigan Operators License, which was turned over to me by PSO Behnen.

#### LOCATING EVIDENCE:

Once Dalton was brought into an interview room I began searching Daltons person and I noticed what appeared to be a couple of pens or pencils in the back lining of the black colored jacket that Dalton was wearing. I then learned that Dalton had a tear on the inside of his right front jacket pocket and numerous items had went through the hole in the lining and lodged in the back of the jacket. I helped Detective Moorian fish those items out of the lining and I learned that one of the items fished out of the jacket was a shell casing. Detective Moorian took custody of that shell casing. Once these items were removed I took the handcuffs off of Dalton and told him that we would need to take the bullet proof vest off of him. After Dalton removed his jacket I noticed that Dalton was also wearing a sweater and once that was taken off of Dalton, I could see he was wearing a bulletproof vest. I assisted in taking the vest off of Dalton and I then took that vest along with the jacket Dalton was wearing and placed it outside of the interview room where it was then turned over to Detective / Sgt. Dunlop from KCSD.

Dalton was asked if he had wanted anything to eat or drink or if he had to use the restroom and Dalton asked for a Coke. Dalton declined any food and he also declined the use of the restroom.

Detective Moorian and I then began our interview of Dalton. For the first 2 hrs of the interview please refer to Detective Moorians report. Both Detective Moorian and I took turns asking Dalton questions and that information is in Detective Moorians report. After Detective Moorian and I

conducted our initial interview with Dalton, Detective McGhee from the Kalamazoo County Sheriffs Department was at KDPS and both he and Detective Moorian entered the interview room and spoke with Dalton. After that portion of the interview had been completed, Detective Moorian and I re-entered the interview room and again spoke with Dalton for approximately (1) hour. The following is a synopsis of that (1) hour interview Detective Moorian and I conducted with Dalton. For specific and complete details of that interview please refer to the DVD of the interview as it was recorded.

#### INTERVIEW WITH JASON DALTON (SUSPECT):

This video begins with Dalton sitting in the interview room by himself before Detective Moorian and I enter and (11) seconds into the video, Dalton is overheard whispering and I am able to hear his say Sorry to you and it appears he says my love. At (4) minutes into the video Detective Moorian and PSO Behnen enter the room and take Daltons clothes and shoes from him and provide him with an orange Kalamazoo County Jail jumpsuit and sandals. Detective Moorian and I then enter the interview room 14 minutes and 41 seconds into the video. We began by telling Dalton that we didnt think that he was nuts and I ensured him that it was not my job to do that. Dalton was told that we understood his explanation that he had given to us about his phone controlling him.

Dalton was asked how many different locations there was and Dalton told us that he didnt really know. I asked Dalton how many he could remember and Dalton responded by saying that he couldnt remember that many of them. I then asked Dalton which ones did he remember and Dalton told us that he did remember after the fact at the Cracker Barrel. I asked Dalton what he remembered about that and Dalton said that he just remembers that he had gunshots and he didnt remember anything else. I asked Dalton if he remembered how many gunshots he remembered and he said that he didnt and he didnt remember anything else. Dalton was asked if he saw the gunshots and Dalton said that he just heard them. I then asked Dalton how he remembered having the gunshots and Dalton said that he remembers the percussion of the gunshots. I asked Dalton if he remembered pulling the trigger and Dalton said that he did not remember pulling the trigger and he just remembers feeling the percussion of the gunshots (it should be noted that as Dalton was saying this, he was making a motion with his right arm extended and on top of the interview room table and his right hand in the shape of a gun). Detective Moorian then asked Dalton if he was referring to feeling it in his hand and the recoil and Dalton shook his head in an affirmative manner and said mmm hmm. Detective Moorian asked Dalton if he felt the recoil and Dalton said he remembered the pop, pop, pop of the gun. Dalton was then asked if he remembered feeling that in his hand and Dalton then told us that he couldnt feel that in his hand. I asked Dalton if he is right or left handed and he told us that he is right handed and I then asked if he would typically shoot a gun with his right or left hand and Dalton said he would typically use his right hand.

I asked Dalton if he remembered getting to the Cracker Barrel or what took him there and he told us no he didnt. I asked Dalton what he remembered after the gunshots and he said that he remembered being back in the car and when I asked where his car was parked he said that he didnt know. I asked Dalton if he remembered where he went after the Cracker Barrel and he said that he didnt. I asked Dalton is he could visualize what was going on when the gunshots were going off at the Cracker Barrel and where the gun was pointed and Dalton said no.

Dalton then told us that when he had gotten pulled over It (referring to his Uber driver app on his phone) switched from the black icon to the red icon. I then asked Dalton if he was an Uber driver and he said that he was and I asked when he became a driver and Dalton said it was a Thursday ago he thought. I asked Dalton if he had to go through some sort of hiring process or if he had to meet with anybody and Dalton said that he never had to meet with anybody. I asked Dalton if Uber had sent him any paperwork and Dalton said no they didnt. Dalton told us that he had just had to take a picture of his license and his insurance. I asked Dalton what vehicle he is approved to drive for Uber and he said that it was an Equinox. Dalton was asked if the riders he had questioned why they were being picked up in a Chevy HHR if he is registered with a Chevy Equinox and Dalton said that the people never even questioned it.

Dalton was asked how many people he had picked up yesterday and Dalton told us that he couldnt remember. I asked Dalton if he remembered

what happened before the Cracker Barrel and where he was and Dalton said that he didnt remember. I then asked Dalton if he remembered any more repercussions or gunshots going off and Dalton said that he did not. Dalton then told us that the last memory that he has is between being arrested and when he was at the dog park. We asked Dalton what dog park and Dalton said that it was the one on 9th St. Dalton then said that he had returned home and met with his best friend, [REDACTED] and they had drove around for a bit. Dalton told us that he didnt remember a lot with his friend [REDACTED] that it was like he was out of body then also. Dalton was asked what he and [REDACTED] were talking about and Dalton said that he didnt even know what they were talking about.

Dalton was asked what made him go to the Cracker Barrel and we asked Dalton if he had a fare (referring to Uber fare) that made him go there and Dalton said no that he had actually picked up (2) people from the Fairfield Inn and his Uber app was having a problem where you swipe the app to start the meter. Dalton said that his Uber app would make him return to the point where he picked up his fare to close out the fare on his app. Dalton was asked where he had taken the people that he had picked up at the Fairfield and Dalton said that he had taken them down to the Beer Exchange and then he had driven all the way back to the Fairfield Inn. I asked Dalton if he remembered how he had driven to get back to the Fairfield and Dalton said that he didnt really remember. I then asked Dalton if he remembered making any stops along the way back to the Fairfield and Dalton said no he didnt. Dalton told us that he knows it all sounds so bizarre and he could see it in our eyes and I explained to Dalton that that wasnt the case, that it was 3:35 am and I was tired.

Dalton then told us that he is not a killer and he knows that he has killed. Dalton said that he could only tell us that it has the ability to take you over. We confirmed with Dalton that he was referring to the Uber app and Dalton said yes. Dalton then told us that it feels like it is coming from the phone itself and he didnt know how to describe that. Dalton was asked if his Uber fare from the Fairfield to the Beer Exchange was before or after the car lot incident and Dalton said that he didnt remember. I asked Dalton who he had picked up at the Fairfield and I asked Dalton if it was 3 females, a female and male or what and Dalton said that he couldnt recall. Dalton was asked if he remembered how much that fare paid from the Fairfield to the Beer Exchange and he told us that he didnt remember what it had paid. Dalton said that as he was sitting there with us, it was almost like artificial intelligence that can tap into your body.

Dalton was again asked if he knew how many incidents there were and he said that he didnt know. Dalton was asked if he knew where the Walmart is on Gull Rd and he did recall that and we told him that there were some apartments behind that Walmart along with a golf course and Dalton told us that he didnt remember being there at all. I asked Dalton how many guns he owns and he said that he owns quite a few. Dalton proceeded to tell us that he couldnt imagine when he had bought them all that he would use them in this manner. Dalton then said that is why he is trying to tell us it is like an artificial presence.

I asked Dalton what gun he would normally carry and if he would open carry it and Dalton told us that he doesnt even have a CPL and he never carried. Dalton said that he always kept his guns locked up at home. I asked Dalton what gun he had bought his holster for and Dalton said it was for the Walter. I asked Dalton what caliber that gun is and he said that he believed that it was 9mm. I asked Dalton if he had carried that gun in a holster last night and Dalton said that he may have had a holster on him but he didnt know.

Dalton was asked about when he reloaded if he had done it in the car and Dalton said that he couldnt recall. Dalton was then asked if he had brought a box of bullets with him and Dalton said no he didnt. Dalton did tell us that he thought that he had (2) magazines loaded. We asked Dalton how many each magazine holds and Dalton told us that he didnt know. I asked Dalton if he had thrown one of the magazines out of the car and Dalton said that he didnt recall throwing anything out. I asked Dalton if he had thrown anything out at the dog park and Dalton said that he didnt believe that he did. Dalton was asked if a fare had taken him to the dog park and Dalton said no that he just wanted to take his dog to the dog park. Dalton was asked if he had any idea what time he had taken his dog to the dog park and Dalton said that he couldnt remember. I asked Dalton if he had went to the dog park in between the time of the Cracker Barrel and him getting stopped and Dalton said that he thought that it was in the daytime when he had went to the dog park.

I asked Dalton where he was headed when he was stopped and Dalton said that the system was telling him to drive. I asked Dalton if he knew where it was telling him to drive and Dalton said that the system was literally telling him to just take turns (as he made a motion with both hands on a steering wheel making turns). I asked Dalton why the system allowed him to stop for the officers and Dalton said that he didnt know. Dalton then told us that he did know one thing, that when the system switched from black to red and when the officer was about to say something to him it went beep beep beep for Dalton to log back into the system. Dalton said that he thinks that that was to make him go like this (as he leans over to his right) to maybe have an officer shoot Dalton. Dalton said that when the system switched back is when Dalton got his presence back. Dalton was asked if the officers had walked up to his window and Dalton said that he thinks they did and Dalton then said that the officers were telling him to put his hands out the window and as his hands were out the window that is when the system went beep beep beep and Dalton used his right hand to log back into the system. I asked Dalton how he was able to stop himself from doing it and Dalton said that he didnt know.

Dalton was asked what made him sign up for Uber and Dalton said that he just wanted to make a little bit of extra money. Dalton was asked if he is in a financial hardship right now and Dalton said no he isnt. Dalton said that he just wanted to make a little bit of extra spending cash. Dalton said now he wishes he wouldve never and then he said that his whole problem started when Dalton said what the symbol represented. We asked Dalton how much money he would make per night driving for Uber and Dalton said that it seemed like it was between \$50-\$80.

Dalton was asked how many car dealerships he had driven through last night and Dalton said that he didnt recall. Dalton was asked if he had ever been to that Cracker Barrel before to eat and Dalton said that he had but it was a long, long, long, long time ago. Dalton was asked if he knew where he parked at the Cracker Barrel and Dalton said no he didnt. We asked Dalton if he knows where Don Seelye Ford is and Dalton said that he does know where that is. We then asked Dalton if he knew what happened there tonight and Dalton said because of what we had told him yes he does. Dalton then told us that the one that he recalls the most is that he was driving on D Avenue / Riverview (Dalton first said that it was River St. however he clarified it by saying that there was a cemetery on the corner and we knew that he was talking about Riverview Drive) and the system had told Dalton to turn left, which was north, and then it made him spin around and there were (2) people and it made Dalton stop there and then he went on. Dalton then told us that there were (2) people there and they were dressed in black coats and Dalton stopped and then looked forward. Dalton told us that he knew that he did not shoot those people. When asked how he knew this Dalton said that he had looked forward. Dalton then asked us if we remember hearing his wifes voice earlier and we said that we did and we asked him why and Dalton said that he just wanted us to make sure we remember hearing her voice so we knew that she was OK.

Dalton was asked if he had grabbed his gun when he had seen the (2) people at Riverview / D Avenue and Dalton said he didnt even grab the gun and the gun was holstered at that time. Dalton was asked where he had went after this and Dalton said that he didnt recall. Dalton did tell us that this had happened when it was still light outside.

I then asked Dalton what made him wear the vest (referring to bulletproof vest) that he was wearing and Dalton told us that literally when he logged onto the site (referring to the Uber app) it started making him be like a puppet. I asked Dalton where that vest had come from and Dalton said that he had bought it for his son, who is an explorer with the county. I asked Dalton where he had bought it and he said that he had bought it for \$100 from a pawn shop in Indiana. Dalton then told us that if he wouldve had tried to have a shoot out with the police, when the log in went from the black symbol back to the red, thats when and Dalton stopped his thought.

Dalton told us that the driver app for Uber is different from the rider app and I then pulled up the Uber driver app in the Google play store and showed the symbol to Dalton. Dalton then told us that when the app would turn from red to black and it was a 5 star driver that is when it was telling you you could drive just as fast as you wanted to. Dalton explained to us that when the app changed from red to black that is when he started having problems. At this time, Lt. Ostrander had asked me to step out of the interview room so he could speak with me. I then re-entered the room shortly thereafter. As I was out of the room, Detective Moorian asked Dalton what he was seeing at the end of the barrel when Dalton

was shooting. Dalton said that that is the really weird thing is that he never even aimed. Dalton then extended his right arm straight out and moved it from side to side and said that he remembered that it just sort of had him and it was directing him as he was shooting. Detective Moorian asked Dalton if he remembered moving his arms and shooting at Cracker Barrel and Dalton said that he remembers having control of him. Dalton said that he remembered being involved in it at the Cracker Barrel, shooting rounds. Dalton was asked if he remembered being involved at Don Seelye Ford and Dalton said that he didnt recall.

Dalton said that he remembers going home after the Cracker Barrel and backing his vehicle up against the fence. I asked Dalton if he remembered talking to his wife and he said that he didnt. I then asked Dalton if at anytime anyone had shot at him and Dalton said no that no one had shot at him. I asked Dalton if he had any thoughts knowing that this would happen and if he had told anyone about it and Dalton said no. Dalton did say that he remembers talking with his wife and something was putting words in his mouth. Dalton then said that he believes that the actions that had taken place are absolutely horrifying and that when he got pulled over that when he had his hands out of the window that if he didnt log back on that it was to get Dalton to move and get into a shootout with the police.

I then asked Dalton if he remembered telling anybody to watch the news last night and Dalton said no (KCSO detectives had received information from Daltons wife that Dalton had told her to watch the news). Dalton then went back to when he had mentioned that he had pulled into his driveway. Dalton said that he remembered that it was like he was going to go and lay down and as soon as he laid down, Dalton had to log back on and the lights on his car outside were on and Dalton couldnt figure out why they were still on. Dalton said that he then went down into the basement and loaded a shotgun and Dalton then shot into his garden shed outside. Dalton said that he remembers thinking why did he do this and he had dropped the shotgun in the yard and picked it back up. Dalton said that he remembers going into the garden shed and there was nothing in there. Dalton was asked if there was supposed to be something in there and Dalton said yes there was and it was like it was directing him to shoot into the barn. I asked Dalton what is normally in the barn and he just said stuff.

Dalton was then asked besides the incident with his shotgun at home and at Cracker Barrel how many times does he remember shooting and Dalton said that he thinks that was it. I asked Dalton what vehicle he was driving around in all day yesterday and Dalton said that he was in the Equinox. Dalton said that the Equinox is silver in color. I asked Dalton what time he had gotten the HHR and he said that he couldnt remember but thought that it was starting to get dark out. Dalton was asked if he would be surprised if we had showed him video of himself shooting (2) people at Don Seelye Ford and Dalton said that he would prefer not to see it. We asked Dalton if he thought that we were making that up and Dalton said that he didnt think we were making anything up.

Dalton said that the thing that is scary to him right now is that Dalton isnt sure how much he had or had not done. Dalton said that is the reason he had us call his wife so he could hear her voice. Dalton said that it would take you over to the point that you are like a puppet. Dalton said that he was afraid that maybe he couldve killed his family. Dalton said that his family was at his parents house when he had shot the shotgun at the garden shed. We also asked Dalton if he has neighbors and Dalton said that he does and we asked if the neighbors wouldve been concerned when he shot at the shed and Dalton said that the probably wouldve been.

Dalton was asked how many times he had shot at the Cracker Barrel and he said that he didnt know and he was also asked if he was inside or outside the building when he shot and Dalton said that he would think he was outside. Dalton was asked if he was seeking out certain people or if he was shooting into a crowd and Dalton said that it was just a random thing. Dalton then told us that he probably wouldve shot all the bullets that were in the magazine. Dalton said that it would then direct him to get back into the car and start driving.

I asked Dalton if he would tell us if there was more and Dalton said that he would and that he is actually afraid that there might be more. Dalton was asked if he thought that the police should drive through the area of Riverview / D Avenue and make sure there isnt anyone that is hurt and Dalton said yeah we should. Dalton said that he doesnt recall shooting those people that were there and they were on the west side of the street

and they were (2) females wearing black coats. Dalton was asked if he had ever backed into his driveway before like he said he did last night and he said that he hadn't. Dalton said that this all started when he signed up for Uber. We asked Dalton if his wife knew about this and he said that she did know that was signed up to be an Uber driver. Dalton said that the really weird thing about Uber was when he had went onto Youtube to see how to sign up, other drivers had different phones but Dalton was allowed to use his own personal phone. Dalton said that you are supposed to have a phone dedicated just for Uber and that it comes with a package but he had never gotten a package.

We then concluded our interview with Dalton.

#### PAPERWORK:

Once I left the interview room I was handed Daltons wallet. I looked through the wallet and in doing so I found (3) business cards that drew my interest. The first business card was for Brass and Bullets Reloading Components and it listed a phone number of [REDACTED] on the business card. The next card that drew my interest was for HolsterCo and it listed a phone number of [REDACTED] on it. The last business card I saw was for Guns Wanted and it listed a phone number of [REDACTED] I seized these cards as evidence.

Also inside the wallet I found a pistol sales record dated 8/22/15. I noticed that the seller on that pistol sales record was Jason Dalton at 7031 Douglas Kalamazoo, MI 49009 and the buyer was On Target located at 6984 W. Main Kalamazoo, MI 49009. The gun information on the pistol sales record was for a Smith & Wesson 40 caliber S&W, 8 shot, barrel length of 3.5, model #4053 and serial number of TVL6931. I seized this as evidence.

The last piece of paper I seized from the wallet was a tag from On Target made out to Jason Dalton at 7031 Douglas Ave Kalamazoo, MI with a phone number of [REDACTED]. The piece of paper listed the item as HK VP9 with a serial number of 224-011015 and listed a sale price of \$669.99 plus tax with a total of \$710.19. The paper listed a date of 9/27/14 on it. This was also seized as evidence.

This concluded my involvement in this incident at this time.

#### BACKGROUND:

On February 20, 2016, Executive Lieutenant Ostrander contacted me and asked me to report to work for a double homicide investigation. Upon my arrival, I met with PSO Caleb Leonard and obtained a short video recording of the suspect vehicle that a citizen had texted to his cell phone. Upon learning that the suspect was in custody, I monitored a portion of the interview of Jason Dalton. I then responded to a briefing at KDPS Headquarters where I was assigned to assist with a search warrant at 7031 Douglas Avenue.

#### CELL PHONE VIDEO:

PSO Caleb Leonard obtained a short cell phone video that had been texted to him by a citizen shortly after the double homicide at Seelye Ford. PSO Leonard downloaded the video from his cell phone to my desktop. The video has been attached to my supplement in ILEADS. I will also download the video to a DVD and place it into evidence. The video shows a short clip of the suspect vehicle at the KIA dealership and then pulling onto Stadium Drive. The suspect can't be seen in the vehicle as it is too blurry.

#### SEARCH WARRANT AT 7031 DOUGLAS AVENUE:

Detective Greg Cordes, Detective Brett Pittelkow and I responded to 7031 Douglas Avenue to deliver additional supplies to the KDPS Lab Technicians that were processing the residence. We assisted with scene security, along with loading several boxes of evidence into the KDPS Crime Lab van.

#### SUMMARY:

On 2/20/16, at approximately 2208 hours, I was dispatched to 4102 Stadium Dr in reference to two males that were just shot. Upon arrival I made contact with witness [REDACTED]. I transported [REDACTED] to KDPS headquarters where she was interviewed by CID. After clearing CID I responded to the traffic stop on Ransom at Walbridge and assisted with a traffic post.

#### ARRIVAL:

Upon arrival I was advised that the victim's were deceased. Sgt. VanderKlok told me to speak with [REDACTED]

#### INTERVIEW WITH WITNESS [REDACTED]

Upon making contact with [REDACTED] she told me that she was with her boyfriend, Tyler, and his father, Rich, looking at vehicles. [REDACTED] told me that she was sitting in the backseat of Tyler's Range Rover, while Tyler and Rich were standing in front of the car looking at a truck. [REDACTED] told me that she saw an older white male walk up, from behind the vehicle she was sitting in, and ask Tyler and Rich what they were looking at. [REDACTED] told me that she thought the male worked there because he came from between the building and her vehicle. [REDACTED] said that he stood directly in front of her vehicle and began shooting at Tyler and Rich immediately after speaking to them. She said that he held the gun with two hands and fired several rounds from a black gun. [REDACTED] did not know how many shots were fired; however, she said he fired "so many rounds that he wouldn't miss." [REDACTED] told me that she saw "gold bullets" coming out of the side of the gun as he was shooting.

[REDACTED] told me that she immediately ducked behind the front seat so that the shooter wouldn't see her. She advised that she ducked down; however, she could see his shadow and she could tell that he walked back the same way he came from. [REDACTED] told me that she waited for approximately 90 seconds then leaned the front seat forward and peaked out of the car to see if she could see the shooter. [REDACTED] said that she snuck out of the car and crawled to Tyler where she took his cell phone from his pocket and called 911.

While waiting for CID to arrive [REDACTED] informed me that she did see one other vehicle while they were looking at cars. She said they were at a used car lot across the street. She described it as having two neon green challengers out front. [REDACTED] said that she remembers seeing a black car that looks like a "longer PT Cruiser". She said it is very similar to a PT cruiser only the model that is a little longer. I showed [REDACTED] an HHR and she said, "Yes". [REDACTED] me that she saw a black HHR in the parking lot across the street prior to pulling into Seely Wright. [REDACTED] then advised that when they pulled into Seely Wright a black HHR pulled in the east entrance and drove quickly, westbound, across the lot. [REDACTED] said that she assumed it was another customer looking at vehicles.

#### INFORMATION:

I called [REDACTED]'s mother, [REDACTED] while en route to CID and had her meet us at CID.

#### SUSPECT INFORMATION:

[REDACTED] described the suspect as a white male with gray and white hair. She said she might remember glasses, but she wasn't sure. [REDACTED] said his hair was short, but not too short, and that it was long enough to spike it. [REDACTED] described him as being taller than her, but shorter than me (5'9") and not fat, but slightly thicker. [REDACTED] described the suspect to be wearing a black coat down to approximately

#### SUMMARY:

On 02/20/2016 at approximately 2208 hours I was dispatched to 4102 Stadium at the Seelye Ford dealership in reference to two subjects who had been shot. Upon arrival officers observed that two subjects had been murdered in the front parking lot. I spoke with two witnesses in regards to this incident, who recorded video of the suspect vehicle exiting the parking lot. The video was transferred to CID for review and the phone used to record the incident was also turned over to CID.

#### ARRIVAL:

Upon my arrival to 4102 Stadium I met briefly with Sgt Boyer, who had just advised that two subjects were dead in the parking lot. I observed that two white males were lying dead in the parking lot in front of the KIA building. I was advised at that time by Lt Kelley that additional witnesses were waiting at the Burger King just west of the Ford dealership. I then responded to 4200 Stadium at the Burger King to make contact with the witnesses.

#### INTERVIEW WITH WITNESS (REDACTED):

(REDACTED) stated that he was traveling westbound on Stadium Dr around the time of the shooting. He stated that while driving with his wife (REDACTED) in the passenger seat, he heard several loud bangs, which he believed were possibly fireworks coming from the Seelye Ford parking lot. He stated that (REDACTED) then told him that the sounds were gunshots, at which point (REDACTED) started watching out of the window to observe the incident. He stated he decided to pull into the parking lot of the Burger King, which is several driveways west of Seelye Ford, and has a clear view of the parking lot. He stated he began taking a video with his Iphone, to capture anything of possible evidentiary value, while (REDACTED) called the police. He stated that in the video he was able to observe a dark colored mid-sized SUV drive westbound through the parking lot then exit, continuing westbound down Stadium. He stated he did not personally see the actual shooting because he was driving, but that his wife (REDACTED) was better able to witness it.

#### INTERVIEW WITH WITNESS (REDACTED):

(REDACTED) stated that she was in the passenger seat with (REDACTED), traveling westbound on Stadium in the 4100 block. She stated that she heard approximately four gunshots, which her husband mistook for fireworks. She stated that she then looked out the window to observe a white male with light colored hair pointing a gun at two additional males. She stated that the two males were lying on the ground, and that the male with the gun was still pointing the gun at them. She stated she did not see where the suspect went after the shooting. She stated that her husband then pulled their vehicle into the parking lot of 4200 Stadium at the Burger King. She said that she observed a female exit a smaller SUV that was parked close to the scene of the shooting, and approach the two subjects on the ground. She stated that after briefly looking at them, she returned to her vehicle and got back inside. She stated she then observed a second dark colored mid-sized SUV pull out of the parking lot and travel westbound on Stadium. She stated that due to the lighting and distance she was only able to tell that the suspect was a white male with light colored hair. She was unable to give a clothing description.

#### VIDEO:

I observed the video taken by (REDACTED). In the video I was able to observe a dark colored mid-sized SUV driving westbound through the parking lot Seelye Ford. I observed the vehicle then exit westbound onto Stadium Dr.

#### SUMMARY:

On Saturday, 02-20-16, at approximately 2208 hours, KDPS was dispatched to 4102 Stadium Dr in reference to two male subjects who had been shot in the parking lot. Upon the first units arrival on scene, it was quickly determined that the two victims were deceased. I did not respond to the scene however continued to monitor radio traffic. During the investigation of this scene, information was obtained from witnesses that the suspect was a W/M and possibly fled in a black or dark blue Chevrolet HHR in an unknown direction.

While KDPS was investigating this murder scene, KCSD was dispatched to 5581 Cracker Barrel Dr, Cracker Barrel Restaurant, for a report of several shots fired into several vehicles. I also monitored this radio traffic and upon officers arrival, they found approximately 5 people who had been shot, 3 which were immediately confirmed deceased via radio traffic. Information was quickly broadcasted that witnesses again said the suspect was a W/M and fled the scene in a black or dark blue Chevrolet HHR.

#### SUSPECT CONTACT:

Due to the violence this suspect had caused, I then began to monitor traffic in the downtown Kalamazoo district in fear that the suspect would return to the city and cause more death or harm to the citizens of Kalamazoo. I began looking for any vehicles that matched the suspect description.

On Sunday, 02-21-16, at approximately 0036 hours, I heard radio traffic from Deputy Harrison that he was following a black Chevrolet HHR near E Kalamazoo / S Pitcher Street. He continued to follow the vehicle and advised he was now north bound on N Pitcher Street crossing E Michigan Ave and was waiting for another marked unit before he attempted to stop the vehicle. I waited at the intersection of N Pitcher / E Ransom in my fully marked patrol vehicle. I was facing south bound on N Pitcher just north of E Ransom when I observed the black Chevrolet HHR and Deputy Harrison in his fully marked patrol vehicle. I advised Deputy Harrison as they turned east bound on E Ransom that I was behind him.

He then activated his emergency lights at which time I activated my emergency lights in an attempt to stop the above vehicle. The suspect vehicle continued east bound at a slow rate but did not stop. Deputy Harrison was in the curb lane behind the suspect vehicle. I then pulled up next to Deputy Harrison patrol vehicle on the inside lane so that I could get a better view of the suspect vehicle. As I did this, the suspect vehicle finally came to a stop on E Ransom just west of Walbridge. Once the vehicle stopped, I quickly exited my patrol vehicle with my department issued handgun drawn. From my position, I only observed one subject inside the vehicle and it appeared the driver side window was partially down.

After the suspect vehicle stopped and I exited my patrol vehicle I observed the suspect just stayed in the vehicle. Deputy Harrison then began to give verbals to the suspect to show us his hands. After several seconds, the suspect then put both of his hands out the driver side window and left them there. Since it appeared he was the loan occupant of the vehicle and we could see his hands clearly, Deputy Harrison and I approached the suspect vehicle. Once at the driver side door, I observed a W/M, later ID as Jason Dalton, was the loan occupant. I advised Deputy Harrison that I would be cover officer while he removed Dalton from the vehicle. Deputy Harrison opened the driver side door and was able to grab a hold of

Dalton hands without incident.

As he pulled him from the vehicle, Deputy Harrison located a handgun on Dalton. I yelled, "Gun". Deputy Harrison took the gun away from Dalton and placed it on the roof of the suspect vehicle. I then holsters my firearm and placed hand cuffs on Dalton.

#### SEARCH INCIDENT TO ARREST:

During my search of Dalton, I located a single bullet in Dalton left front pant pocket. I left the bullet in his pocket and did not locate any other contraband. Dalton was placed in Deputy Harrison patrol vehicle and then placed into Pso Behnen patrol vehicle for transport. During my entire time with Dalton he never said anything nor did I ask him anything. I advised Pso Behnen to take custody of Dalton and to transport him to CID to be interviewed. Pso Behnen positively ID Dalton as the shooter from Stadium Dr after he had watched the video from security cameras.

#### SCENE SECURITY:

I then assigned Pso Brooks to watch the gun and the suspect vehicle until LAB showed up to process the scene. I also assigned Pso Hofer to block off traffic at E Ransom / Porter. Pso Perez was assigned to block off traffic at E Ransom / Walbridge. He was later relieved by Pso Vosburg. I also stayed at the scene for scene security. Lab arrived to seize the gun. Det. Pittelkow seized Dalton wallet and cell phone.

#### VEHICLE DISPOSITION:

Pso Brooks impounded the suspect vehicle and took it to Station 4/5 to be processed by Lab. See Pso Brooks report.

#### ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

After the vehicle was impounded, I cleared the scene. I had no further involvement.

#### INFORMATION:

I was contacted at home on 2/20/16 at approximately 2230 hrs and requested to respond to CID in reference to a shooting incident that had occurred. I arrived at KDPS CID and was informed that two people were shot and killed at Don Seelye Ford and that there were two other shooting incidents that were related. I was informed that there was a witness to the Don Seelye shooting in the CID lobby that needed to be interviewed.

#### INTERVIEW WITH [REDACTED]:

I interviewed [REDACTED] in a CID interview room at 2355 hrs. I asked her to explain to me what had occurred tonight. [REDACTED] said that she was picked up at her house today around 12 noon by her boyfriend, Tyler Smith. [REDACTED] said that the two drove around looking at some cars for Smith to buy then they went to Smiths house to watch movies. [REDACTED] said that around 2000 hrs they left with Smiths father, Richard Smith to go look at some new cars for Smith. [REDACTED] explained how they were showing Smiths father the same vehicles that they looked at earlier. [REDACTED] said that they first went to a dealership in Schoolcraft, then went to Cole Nissan on Stadium Dr. and ended up at Don Seelye Ford. [REDACTED] said that they pulled in the parking lot at Don Seelye

to look at a large blue pickup truck. Tyler was driving and Richard Smith was in the front passenger seat while [REDACTED] stated she was in the back seat of Tylers gray Range Rover. [REDACTED] said that she stayed in the back seat of the Range Rover while Tyler and Richard were looking at the blue pickup truck that was for sale. [REDACTED] said that she was watching Tyler and Richard from the back seat of the Range Rover when she noticed someone walk up to them. [REDACTED] said that this person walked up coming from behind the Range Rover and the person was described as an older w/m with gray and white hair wearing all black. [REDACTED] said that she believes the w/m said something to Tyler and Richard about the truck then he just began to shoot them. [REDACTED] said that she saw both Tyler and Richard fall to the ground and she then crouched down in the back seat of the Range Rover to hide from the shooter. [REDACTED] said that she continued to crouch down until she believed the suspect was gone. [REDACTED] said that she then went to Tyler and Richard and used Tylers phone to call 911. [REDACTED] explained how while they were at Cole Nissan waiting to pull out onto Stadium Dr. she noticed a vehicle resembling a Chevrolet HHR driving towards them in a side aisle. [REDACTED] stated that she wasnt sure if that vehicle followed them or not to Don Seelye Ford.

#### ADDITIONAL:

I had learned that through video surveillance at Don Seelye Ford that the suspect was driving a black HHR and that the shooter was a w/m. A short time later a traffic stop was conducted on a black HHR on the north side of the City and the suspect, Jason Dalton was arrested. Dalton was transported to KDPS by PSO Behnen. Det. Ghiringhelli and I interviewed Dalton.

#### INTERVIEW WITH DALTON:

Det. Ghiringhelli and I met PSO Benhen and Dalton in the lobby and escorted him upstairs to a CID interview room. Dalton was searched again and unhandcuffed. Before the interview started, Dalton was asked if he wanted to use the bathroom, or if he would like anything to eat or drink and he requested a coca cola, to which he was provided. The interview started at approximately 0100 hrs. I explained to Dalton that neither Cory, nor I have ever had any contact with him in the past and that we know nothing about him at this point. I then explained to Dalton that everything happens for a reason and there are obviously some things that are going on in his life right now and that we would like to talk to him

about them. I then informed Dalton that since he arrived in handcuffs and since he isnt free to just walk outta here I have to read him his miranda rights. I then asked Dalton if he knows what his miranda rights are and he said you, you may, yes. I then asked Dalton again if he knew what his miranda rights were and he nodded his head up and down in an affirmative manner. I then read Dalton his miranda rights from my department issued miranda card. I asked Dalton if he understood his rights and he said yea and again nodded his head up and down in an affirmative manner. Dalton said that he would rather not talk, so I tell Dalton that everything happens for a reason and only he can explain what happened today and that he isnt going to want anybody else speaking for him. Dalton said that I would prefer to not say anything. I asked Dalton if he feels bad for what happened tonight to all of the people and he said he would rather not say anything.

I explained to Dalton that Cory and I know through our experience that he isnt going to want other people to talk for him and that only he can explain what happened and what was going through his mind. Dalton explained how he was married with children and that his family is just fine. I asked Dalton if there was a neighbor or maybe someone else that we didnt know about that he has had contact with today that might need some medical attention and he said no. I asked Dalton what time did he wake up today, referring to Saturday 2/20/16 and he said he wasnt sure. I then asked Dalton where he woke up today and he asked if he could just plead the fifth and I said yes.

I asked Dalton if he would like to call any family or friends and he said no. I asked Dalton if he wanted anything to eat and he said no he didnt. I asked Dalton if he is on any medications and he said no. I asked Dalton if he has taken any drugs today and he said no. I asked Dalton if he had any questions for us at this point and he said that he didnt. Dalton was informed by Det. Ghiringhelli that the jail is going to need to know if he is suicidal or thinking about hurting himself and he said that he wasnt. Det. Ghiringhelli and I left the interview room for a brief while, but informed Dalton to just knock on the door if he needed anything.

Sgt. Dunlop conducted a gunshot residue collection kit and took photographs of Dalton. Det. Ghiringhelli and I began to speak with Dalton after Sgt. Dunlop was finished with the gunshot residue kit and photographs. I explained to Dalton that he is going to look like the biggest monster if he doesnt explain why this happened tonight and Dalton said he would just prefer to say nothing. I asked Dalton if he was aware just how many lives that he has just completely destroyed tonight and he said he didnt. I asked Dalton what he felt was the next step was for him and he said he wasnt sure. I asked him if he cared and he said he did care referring to what happens to him. I informed Dalton that in my experience he is going to regret not explaining himself to us and that after today he wont have any opportunity to explain why he did what he did. I informed Dalton that only he can tell us what was going on in his mind, nobody else. Dalton was asked if he needed to use the restroom, food or drink at this point and he said no. I began to ask Dalton again to explain himself and elaborated how he will regret not doing this and he said he would rather not. I then asked Dalton if he would rather write it down on paper and he said he would rather not say anything. I asked Dalton if he would like to have a phone to call someone and he said no.

I made reference to Daltons wedding ring and asked him how long has he been married and he said since 1995. I asked Dalton what time he typically goes to bed and he said around 10pm. Dalton was asked if he has any pets and he said he has a female German Shepard. I asked Dalton if he has a friend that he confides in and he said he does, but doesnt wish to get him involved. I asked Dalton if someone did something to make him upset recently or a long time ago and he said no. I asked Dalton if he is an online gamer and he said no. Dalton was wearing a bulletproof vest when taken into custody and he was asked where he obtained the vest and he said he would rather not say.

Dalton was informed that his life is more than what has occurred in the last several hours and that just isnt fair to him or his family. I asked Dalton if his wife would be surprised when she finds out what happened tonight and he said he would rather not talk about it. Dalton was asked for his permission to go into his cell phone to retrieve his wifes phone number and he said that would be fine. I asked Dalton if his phone has a code to get into it and he informed us the passcode was 4544. Dalton went on to explain that he has a 68 Camaro and a 66 mustang and the 4544 passcode is a reference to the big block Chevy 454 engine. Dalton said that his wife has a Hummer H3. Dalton appeared to be distracted when trying to have a conversation with him and I asked him what was he thinking about and he said nothing. I informed Dalton that he appears to be a pleasant person and he thanked us for being so nice to him. Dalton was asked if it bothered him to sit in the interview room talking to us and he said it

didn't bother him either way. Dalton was asked about his upbringing and said he was born in Indiana and moved up here as a child.

Dalton asked me if I could dial a phone number for him and I said sure. I dialed [REDACTED] which is Dalton's parents phone number and put the call on speakerphone. Det. Johnson from the Kalamazoo County Sheriff's office answered the phone and I spoke with him briefly then Dalton's wife Carol got on the phone. Dalton just wanted to hear his wife's voice, then ended the call. Dalton explained how he and his family split their time between his house on Douglas and his parents house. I asked Dalton what time did he wake up this morning and he said he woke up around 8 a.m. I then asked Dalton what his daily routine is after he gets up and he said he would rather not talk about it. Dalton was explained that the families of the deceased deserve an explanation and I asked him if he thought the same and he said yes, but that he would like to plead the fifth. Dalton was asked how the families of the deceased would get the answers that they deserve and he didn't respond. I informed Dalton that he could actually do some good right now for the families that lost their loved ones and Dalton said he would like to just plead the fifth. I asked Dalton if he could go back in time 12 hours from now would he and he said he believes everyone would do that. I informed Dalton that it was currently 2am and asked him if he could go back in time to 2pm would he and he said he yea I would and then when asked if he would do anything different in those 12 hours would he and he replied I'd like to just plead the fifth. I again asked Dalton if he would do anything different if he could go back 12 hours from now and he began to pronounce the word yes but never finished and said I'd like to just plead the fifth. I told Dalton that he almost said it, referring to yes, then informed him that he will feel better if he just talks about it.

Dalton was informed that he owes an explanation to not only the victims families, but also his wife and kids. Dalton was informed that his children will have to live with this all through school, but he can get in front of this right now and just give an explanation as to the why. Dalton said he would just prefer to not say anything. Det. Ghiringhelli asked if he would like a message sent to his children and he said no. I asked Dalton if something occurring in the world, or in his life that triggered him to do what he did and he said nothing triggered him. I asked Dalton if he was on any psychotic or psychosis drugs, mental disabilities, currently seeing a psychiatrist, bipolar and he said no to all of these. Det. Ghiringhelli asked Dalton if he ate any food last night and he said he did. Dalton said he drinks no alcohol and doesn't smoke either. Dalton was asked if he was on any medicine at all or if he had any medical problems at all and he said no. Dalton was asked if his co-workers are going to be surprised referring to what he did and he said I imagine there will be a lot of people surprised. I asked Dalton if he was an anti-government, militia type person and he said no.

Dalton was asked what he would think if one of the victims was a child and he said that would be sad. I asked Dalton if he intended to hurt a child, or did he not know there was a child there and he said I did not know there was a child. I clarified with Dalton and stated to him you weren't aiming at a child and he said no. Dalton was informed that he owes an explanation to the child's family and he said I know. I then asked Dalton if he was aware that there was a girl hiding in the back of the Land Rover at Don Seely's and he said he wasn't aware of that. I informed Dalton that she was the boyfriend to the young boy that he killed. I informed Dalton that that was a young boy and his father that he killed and the girlfriend was watching from the car and he said he would like to plead the fifth. I informed Dalton that it's okay if he pleads the fifth, but both Det. Ghiringhelli and I want him to know what horrific tragedy he has caused to all of these people. I asked Dalton if there was anything he would like to say to the girl that was hiding in the car and he said he would like to plead the fifth.

I informed Dalton that we did establish that he didn't mean to kill a child and he said I did not know there was a child, no. I asked Dalton that if he was able to, would he take back the killing of the child and he said yes. Dalton went on to explain how he didn't know there was a child victim and that did make him feel badly. I informed Dalton that it's not going to change anything, but we just want to know why he did what he did. I then asked Dalton if he thought we were lying to him about one of the people he killed tonight was a child and he said I don't believe you are lying to me no. I then asked Dalton if he feels bad for killing a child and he said that he did feel bad for that. I then asked Dalton if it was an accurate statement that he just didn't see the child in front of him when he was shooting and he said that was a correct statement. I raised my right arm and extended it as if I was holding a gun when I was asking Dalton this question. I asked Dalton if there was anything else he would like to say, or for us to convey for him to anybody and he said no. I then asked Dalton if he had any words for the parents of the child that he killed and he said that

Im sorry.

I then asked Dalton how many different locations did he shoot people at today, just in case we arent aware of one of them and maybe there is someone suffering in a ditch. Dalton said that he would like to just plead the fifth. Det. Ghiringhelli and I both explained to Dalton that we just want to make sure someone isnt lying somewhere not dead yet and he said he was certain that wasnt the case. I again asked Dalton for the number of different locations that he shot people at today and he said he just doesnt want to discuss it. Dalton was asked of what the next step for him was going to be and he was informed that he would be booked, and lodged in the county jail until he was to be arraigned in a few days. Dalton was asked if he knew why he was currently at the police station and he said yes, but wouldnt elaborate on it. I informed Dalton that he was obviously here for the killing of a child, but did he actually know how many people he killed tonight and he said he would like to just plead the fifth. Dalton was asked again if he needed to use the bathroom or needed any food or something to drink and he said he was fine. Det. Ghiringhelli and I then leave the room at this point for a while.

I was informed by Det. McGhee from the Sheriffs Office that he actually knows Dalton through his son being in the explorer program at the Sheriffs office. McGhee said that he would be willing to try and speak with Dalton. Det. McGhee and I went back into the interview room with Dalton. Det. McGhee began to try and speak with Dalton, but he said he didnt really want to talk. Dalton was asked if he had any idea how many people he had shot and he said no. I then asked Dalton if he cared how many people were shot and he said he did care. I then asked Dalton if he wanted to know how many people he killed and he said he just wanted to keep his mouth shut. Dalton was asked what the connection between all of the people and him are and he said there was no connection. Dalton was asked if we needed to look for additional scenes and he said that we found everything.

Det. McGhee was asked if we could agree that he killed multiple people tonight and he said yes, but wouldnt like to elaborate on it. I explained to Dalton that since I walked out and came back into the room, another person died and they were 14 yrs old. I asked Dalton if he felt badly about that and he said he did. I asked Dalton if he has fantasized about doing this or did someone make him do what he did tonight and he said no to both questions. I asked Dalton if he thought in his mind if this was normal and he said no.

Dalton was asked what he did in between the shootings and he said he was just driving around. Dalton was asked why he was wearing the vest and if there was a plan behind that and he said no. Dalton was asked if he was going to shoot the police officer that stopped him and he said no. Sgt. McGhee asked if all of the shootings were just random or was there was there something particular about the victims and he said it was just random. Dalton was asked what do we tell the teenagers dad and he said I didnt mean to kill him, Im sorry for what happened there. Dalton then said that he has remorse for it yes.

I asked Dalton what was going through his mind tonight at Don Seelye Ford and he said he didnt want to say. I informed Dalton that the entire incident is on video at Don Seelye. Dalton said that if we only knew, it would blow our mind. Dalton then explains how when he opens up the Uber taxi App a symbol appeared and he recognized that symbol as the Eastern Star symbol. Dalton acknowledged that he recognized the Uber symbol as being that of the Eastern Star and a devil head popped up on his screen and when he pressed the button on the app, that is when all the problems started. Dalton said that he started driving for Uber just last Thursday. Dalton said that the Iphone can take you over. Dalton explained how you can drive over 100mph and go through stop signs and you can just get places. Dalton said he wishes he would never have spoken what that symbol was when he saw it on his phone. Dalton described the devil figure as a horned cow head or something like that and then it would give you an assignment and it would literally take over your whole body. Sgt. McGhee asked Dalton if Uber told him what his assignment was tonight and he said that since the minute he logged on tonight, he doesnt remember anything. Dalton was asked if he recalled shooting some people tonight and he said he did recall that, but other than that, he doesnt remember anything. Dalton said that it starts out that you have to follow the navigation, but it gets to the point where you dont have to drive at all, the car just goes. Dalton said that as long as you have a 2007 or newer car, your phone can link through your car. Dalton said he was seeing himself from outside of his body. Dalton said that this thing knows

where everyone is through your phone. Dalton said that it knows everything and when I asked what it was he said whatever Uber is attached to. I asked Dalton if he has ever told anybody about this and he said no. Dalton said that he just signed up for Uber just last Thursday and was picking up fares in between work assignments from his regular job at an insurance company. Dalton then went on to talk about the Masons and the Eastern Star symbol, but it didnt make any sense. I asked Dalton what the Eastern Star meant and he said it was Masonic. Dalton then said that his grandmother was in the Eastern Star and his grandfather was in the Masons.

Dalton explained how there is a customer service score on Uber and when he tapped the button, he could say anything he wanted to about the person and it would be anonymous. Dalton then said that he could hear other peoples phones ding and their score or rating would go down. I asked Dalton if he picked up any fares tonight and he said he picked up some people near the State Theater and when they got into his car, they were talking about a shooting spree that was going on in Kalamazoo. Dalton said that the people he picked up said that the shooter was in a blue car and not a black car, like he was driving. Dalton said the he drove the people to the Up and Under Bar. Dalton was asked what was different tonight from the other nights and he said as a driver partner with Uber, the icon is red and it had changed to black tonight. Dalton said it also told him to be available all the time. Sgt. McGhee asked Dalton if it told him to do anything differently tonight than it has in the past and he said it wasnt like a telling, it was more of like a control. Dalton said that he doesnt want to come across as being a crazy person, that why he was pleading the fifth earlier. Dalton said that Uber requires a drivers to have a car newer than 2007 and when you plug into it, you can actually feel the presence on you.

I asked Dalton why was he carrying his firearm tonight and he said that the Uber App literally took over his mind and body. Dalton said that when the Uber symbol is red, it is just picking up and dropping off people, but when he recognized the symbol and spoke what the symbol was, the color changed from red to black. Dalton said that as soon as the police officer stopped him tonight, the symbol went from black to red and he felt like he was no longer being guided. Dalton said that was the reason he didnt shoot the officer because the app went from black back to red. Dalton explained that when the symbol turns to black, it literally has control over you. I asked Dalton why didnt he just uninstall the app and he said it sort of had you at a certain point. Dalton said that if he wouldve never ever mentioned the Uber symbol resembling the Eastern Star, he never wouldve had any problems.

I asked Dalton what made him get his gun tonight and he said the Uber App made him. Dalton said that the Uber App also made him put on the vest as well. Dalton said that there is something bigger than Uber just picking up people and dropping them off. Dalton also said that you should never get into a black Uber and it was Uber that made him switch vehicles today from his silver equinox to the black Chevrolet HHR. Dalton said that the HHR is his parents vehicle. Det. McGhee asked Dalton if there was anything else he wanted us to know and he said that this isnt who he is. I asked Dalton if he had his phone right now could he uninstall the app, would he be fine and he said he didnt know. I asked Dalton if he remembered shooting people and he said he doesnt remember that. I then asked Dalton about the people that got into his car that he drove to the Up and Under and Dalton said that was weird how they were saying that it was a blue car that was doing the shooting when he knew it wasnt a blue car. Dalton was asked if he was nervous that the people might figure out he was the shooter and Dalton said he wasnt nervous at all about that. Dalton said that he understands now how the other mass shootings take place. Dalton explained how he has experienced a full body takeover, that is how he can understand the other mass shootings. Dalton expressed concern for being put in the general population at the jail and I asked if it was because based on what he did tonight and he nodded his head in an affirmative manner.

I asked Dalton if he had a holster or did he put the gun in his pocket and he said that he went and bought a holster today at On Target. I asked Dalton what time did he purchase it and he said he couldnt remember what time. Dalton said that he is sad for the people that have been killed and that he is sad for his family that they are going to have to hear all of this. Prior to walking out Dalton was asked if he needed any food or something to drink and he refused. Dalton was also asked if he needed to use the bathroom and he said no. Det. McGhee and I left the interview room at this time. Det. Ghiringhelli and I then came back into the interview room a short time later. Please see Det. Ghiringhellis report for this portion of the interview.

Dr. Douglas indicated the cause of death for Richard Smith was multiple gunshot wounds, and the manner of death was homicide.

Dr. Prahlow indicated the cause of death for Tyler Smith was multiple gunshot wounds, and the manner of death was homicide.

#### INFORMATION SUMMARY:

On Saturday 2-20-16 at 2242 hours I responded to 4102 Stadium Drive reference to a homicide investigation. On arrival I made contact with Sgt Boyer who debriefed me on what occurred. I was advised that two male subjects were looking at a vehicle in the lot of Seelye Kia at 4102 Stadium Drive when a lone male subject walked up and shot them numerous times with a handgun. The lone male gunman got back into a vehicle and fled the scene.

Shortly after the Seelye Kia shooting KCSD responded to a shooting investigation at the Cracker Barrel (5581 Cracker Barrel Blvd) in the area of 9th Street/I-94. Five victims were shot at this location. Four of the five victims died from their injuries. One victim was transported to Bronson Hospital with critical injury.

Prior to this investigation at approximately 1740 hours KCSD responded to 5111 Highmeadow Drive reference to a shooting investigation where a female was shot by an unknown male. The suspect fired multiple shots at this location. KCSD case number is 16-01707. I assisted with investigation, KDPS 16-02421, see that report for details.

#### SCENE:

The incident occurred at 4102 Stadium Drive which is Seelye Kia of Kalamazoo. Seelye Kia of Kalamazoo is located on the north side of Stadium Drive east of Seneca Drive in the City of Kalamazoo, County of Kalamazoo, Michigan.

Seelye Kia has a shared parking lot with Seelye Ford of Kalamazoo (3820 Stadium Drive) which is east of the Kia dealership. There are two driveways that access the dealerships (Ford & Kia). There is a west driveway that is near the Kia dealership and an east driveway that is in front of the Ford dealership.

The parking lot lights were not on at the time of incident. The only lighting was from the buildings and from the streetlights along Stadium Drive.

I was advised by officers on scene that the Range Rover that was driven by the victims was running with headlights activated when they arrived, but the vehicle was turned off prior to my arrival.

#### SCENE EXAMINATION:

In front of the Kia dealership along the sidewalk is a row of vehicles for sale. In the middle of this row of vehicles is a concrete island where the large Kia sign is located. Near the east end of the row of vehicles is another sign for Seelye Auto Group New & Used vehicles. At the east end of the row of vehicles is the west driveway for the dealerships.

East of the Seelye Auto Group New & Used sign just west of the west driveway there was a blue truck that was parked on a slight angle that was for sale. Behind the truck facing east was a black BMW that was for sale. Just west of the BMW was a gray Range Rover SUV. The Range Rover was the victim's vehicle.

The two victims were found lying on the parking lot in front of the Range Rover. The victim's were covered with white sheets prior to my arrival. The younger white male was lying on his back with his feet facing southeast and head facing northwest. His arms were out from his side. He was wearing a gray short sleeve shirt, jeans and tan moccasin shoes. He had visible blood on his face and shirt. He had a gunshot wound to his upper left arm and an abrasion to his left hand. The older white male was lying on his left side and stomach with his feet facing northeast and head southwest. His arms were pulled in towards his chest. His forehead was resting on the upper left leg of the younger male. He was wearing a blue sweatshirt, white shirt, jeans and brown boots. No visible injury noted in position found.

Around the gray Range Rover I located numerous casings, bullet and bullet jacket fragment. The items were marked with yellow evidence placards. The evidence was as follows:

PSO Wright reviewed the surveillance video from the dealership and advised me that after the suspect shot the victims he walked up to the driver's door of the BMW. It appeared that the suspect grabbed the driver's door handle. I collected DNA swab samples from the driver's door handle

and driver's rear door handle of the black BMW (Item #19/Item #20). I also processed the driver's door handle and driver's rear door handle for latent prints. On examination I developed one (1) latent print on the driver's door handle (L401).

Six (6) surveillance cameras were on the exterior of the Seelye Kia building. Two video cameras were on the south side of the building. One camera was on the east side of the building at the north corner. Two cameras on the north side of the building at the west corner and one camera was on the west side of the building at the north corner.

The gray Range Rover was examined and no damage was found as a result of the shooting.

While on scene a traffic stop was conducted on a black HHR vehicle downtown Kalamazoo. The driver of the vehicle was detained and later identified as the suspect for the two shooting investigations (Seelye and Cracker Barrel).

#### CONNECTING CASE NUMBERS:

After the suspect was arrested it was determined that the 5111 Highmeadow Drive shooting incident (KCSD 16-1707/KDPS 16-2421), Gull/G Ave Hit-Run incident (MSP 51-733-16), 4102 Stadium Drive shooting incident (KDPS 16-02433) and 5581 Cracker Barrel Blvd shooting incident (MSP 51-740-16/KCSD 16-1715) were all connected.

#### SEARCH WARRANT (7031 Douglas Avenue):

#### INFORMATION SUMMARY:

On Saturday 2-20-16 at approximately 1749 hours Kalamazoo County Sheriff Department responded to 5111 Highmeadow Drive reference to a person that had been shot (KCSD 16-01707). The victim was transported to Borgess Hospital with critical injuries. On 2-20-16 at 1903 hours I responded to this location to assist with scene processing (KDPS 16-02421). Just prior to clearing this location KDPS dispatch reported shots fired and persons down at Seelye Kia at 4102 Stadium (2-20-16/2208 hours). The two victims died on scene from their injuries. I responded to this location at 2242 hours on 2-20-16 (KDPS 16-02433). At approximately 2224 hours on 2-20-16 KCSD dispatch reported shots fired at the Cracker Barrel Restaurant at 9th Street/1-94. Responding units arrived on scene and reported five persons had been shot. Four victims died from their injuries and one victim was transported to Bronson Hospital with critical injuries.

The suspect vehicle was said to be a dark colored Chevrolet HHR. This vehicle was seen at the Stadium Drive incident and Cracker Barrel incident.

The dark colored Chevrolet HHR was stopped downtown Kalamazoo in the early morning of 2-21-16 and the driver was detained. The driver was later arrested and identified as the suspect.

A search warrant was drafted by Det/Sgt Jeffrey Baker of KCSD for Jason Brian Dalton's address at 7031 Douglas Avenue. The search warrant was under KCSD case number 16-01707. The search warrant was signed and issued on 2-21-16 at 0229 hours.

Lab Technician Thomas and I responded to 7031 Douglas Avenue to execute the search warrant.

#### SEARCH WARRANT EXECUTION:

We arrived at 7031 Douglas Avenue on 2-21-16 at 0335 hours and executed the warrant.

All documentation and evidence collected from this location was under KDPS 16-02433 and connected to KCSD 16-01707.

7031 Douglas Avenue is a tan single story residence with white trim located on the northwest corner of Douglas Avenue/West E Avenue, Township of Cooper, County of Kalamazoo, Michigan.

Lab Technician Thomas examined the main level and exterior of the residence and I examined the basement of the residence.

#### SEARCH WARRANT EXAMINATION:

The basement stairs are off of the small hallway from the rear family room that leads into the kitchen.

The basement is an open concept with the exception of the southwest corner. The basement was cluttered.

In the northwest corner of the basement is the laundry area. This area has clothing folded on shelves and clothing hanging from a bar. Also in this area are numerous totes. At the base of the stairs to the right is shelving units that held food items. Along the south wall and east of the food shelves there were additional totes and items. In the southeast corner of the basement was a desk. This appeared to an office area. On the desktop I found a laptop, cameras, cell phone, I-pad and computer printer. I found paperwork for appraisal work for Michigan Appraisal Company. Along the east wall near the desk I found a couch. In the northeast corner of the basement were miscellaneous items. In the center of the basement was a counter and cabinetry. The hot water heater and HVAC were on the north side of the cabinet/counter. On the north side of the counter/cabinetry was miscellaneous items.

In the southwest corner of the basement right of the stairs is a small room with a door that was found open. The door to this room has a door lock and a secondary deadbolt lock. The door hardware and door-jam hardware was not damaged. In this room along the east wall and left of the door was a large shelving unit. On this shelving unit was items related to hunting/firearms such as air soft pellets, firearm ammunition, casings, bullets, black powder, flashlights, camping items, holsters, firearm magazines, knives. Along the south wall was a table that was used for reloading firearm ammunition. On top of the table I found two handguns, ammunition, casings, bullets and handgun magazine. Along the west wall was another table that contained miscellaneous tools and items. A small box was found that contained casings and primer caps. On the north wall was a steel mesh door with a reinforced steel door frame that enters into a small room. The steel mesh door was found in the open position. The steel mesh door and hardware was not damaged. Just outside the steel mesh door to the right was an assault type rifle and a pump action shotgun. Inside the small room were additional rifles and handguns.

The ammunition, casings, bullets, Glock Model 19 9mm handgun with Walther 9mm gun case and magazine, Sig-Sauer P226 9mm handgun with case and magazine were collected from the reloading table that was along the south wall of the southwest basement room. All of the items were

marked with yellow evidence placard #16 and collected. These items were collected on 2-21-16 at 0615 hours.

On the floor left of the reloading table and in front of the shelf there was a large plastic tote. On the lid of the tote was a black leather bag. Inside the bag were earmuffs, glasses, casings and ammunition. The earmuffs and glasses were removed and left at the residence. The black bag and contents were marked with yellow evidence placard #17 and collected on 2-21-16 at 0615 hours. Also on top of the tote was a Rock Chucker Master Reloading Kit box that contained ammunition, casings and bullets. #### BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

I was contacted by Capt. Ledbetter on 02-20-16 at 10:23pm to report that officers were on scene at Don Seelye Kia with 2 confirmed dead victims in the parking lot. He told me that Kalamazoo County Sheriff Dept. was working a separate shooting incident at the Cracker Barrel Restaurant. I then began calling in detectives and lab personnel to assist in the investigation. I called Lab Specialist Bombich and advised him of the shooting incidents and asked if he could call in every lab person and have them come in tonight to assist. He obtained a working team of lab personnel consisting of Bombich, Neldon, T. Thomas and L. Denharder.

I called all detectives and obtained a team of Goodell, Moorian, Ghiringhelli, Cordes, Dahlinger and B. Pittelkow. Sgt. W. Moore and Capt. Ledbetter also came in to assist.

#### ASSIGNING DUTIES:

Once all the detectives were updated on the crime, I assisted Capt. Ledbetter and Sgt. W. Moore in assigning detectives to tasks as they came up. I asked Det. Moorian to interview [REDACTED] the witness to the shooting of Richard and Tyler Smith. Det. Pittelkow and Cordes were asked to locate and contact the family members of Richard and Tyler Smith to deliver the death notification to them. The entire lab processed the scene at Seelye Kia, they were then split up to fulfill numerous related tasks to the investigation. Lab Spec. Bombich and Denharder were sent to the handle the post for all 6 deceased persons from both the Seelye and Cracker Barrel homicide incidents. I requested Lab. Spec. Sgt. Jim Dunlop of the Kalamazoo County Sheriff Dept. to would take photos of Jason Dalton's vehicle as it sat at Ransom and Porter St. before it was impounded. I sent Lab. Spec. Thomas and Neldon to process the scene of the suspect, Jason Dalton's home at 7031 Douglas St. Det. Sgt. Jeff Baker from the Kalamazoo County Sheriff Dept. completed a search warrant for the residence on Douglas, it was processed by Neldon and Thomas with the assistance of Dets. Cordes, Goodell and Pittelkow. I went to 7031 Douglas St. to see the residence and the guns that had been located. I was only on scene for about 15 minutes as I had to leave to handle another task. I did not search the residence and did not locate any evidence while on scene.

Jason Dalton's 2007 black Chevy HHR with MI plate 0JKH34 had been impounded Station 4/5 at 601 N. Park St. I then typed a search warrant for Mr. Dalton's 2007 Chevy HRR. Upon completion of the search warrant and affidavit, I swore to the facts by phone to 8th Dist. Judge Kropf. The search warrant and affidavit was then faxed to Judge Kropf at 06:55am. It was signed and faxed back to me. I make a copy of the search warrant and gave it to Sgt. Jim Dunlop and he executed the search warrant and processed Mr. Dalton's vehicle at 07:35am. I scanned the search warrant, affidavit and tabulation into this report. I placed the original in the court office box in the KDPS report room. It should be noted that investigators had been told that all five victims of the Cracker Barrel shooting incident had died of their injuries. I placed this information in my search warrant for Mr. Dalton's vehicle. It was not until later after the search warrant was signed and executed that investigators had been informed that one of the victims at the Cracker Barrel homicide had not died but was still in critical condition.

It should be noted that at all times during this investigation, we were in constant contact of Lt. Chuck Christensen and numerous Michigan State Police detectives as well at Det. Bill Sparrow and several other Kalamazoo County Sheriff Dept. detectives. All three agencies were in the KDPS

INTERVIEW WITH [REDACTED]

Just prior to me going home for the morning, I was contacted by KDPS Sgt. Scott Smith who told me that dispatch had received a call from [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] reported that he and his friends were driven downtown just before 10pm last night by Jason Dalton in his Uber. I then called [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] told me that he is staying at the Fairfield Inn at 6420 Cracker Barrel Rd., he told me he is in town for the day but is leaving for home in New York later this afternoon. I then drove to the Fairfield Inn and interviewed [REDACTED] as well as his friends [REDACTED].

I met with [REDACTED] in the lobby of the hotel. I asked [REDACTED] why he believed it was Mr. Dalton who gave him a ride last night. It should be noted that I was not familiar with the process of renting an Uber cab and exactly how it worked. [REDACTED] explained that he, [REDACTED] wanted to go to the Beer Exchange at 211 E. Water St. [REDACTED] used his cell phone to connect to the Uber application. He ordered the Uber cab and received a confirmation reply from Uber at 9:21pm saying that "Jason" was enroute to pick them up and there was a picture of their driver Jason on the confirmation. [REDACTED] said that Uber reported that Jason was driving a Chevy Equinox vehicle. [REDACTED] said that he ordered the Uber while inside the Fairfield Inn and the GPS ping should have shown him at the hotel for Jason to locate them. [REDACTED] reported that after several minutes they noticed a black Chevy HRR driving around the parking lot of the Cracker Barrel and circling the building. It should be noted that [REDACTED] advised that his hotel room faced the Cracker Barrel Restaurant. At 9:29pm, Jason called [REDACTED] phone from [REDACTED] 3 and told [REDACTED] he could not find them. [REDACTED] told Jason to pick them up at the Fairfield Inn.

[REDACTED] explained that Jason picked them up in his black Chevy HRR and he was having difficulty connecting to the Uber application site to start the fare. He tried connecting to the Uber site several times and was unable to get connected. [REDACTED] stated that Jason had told them that he just started with Uber on Thursday and he is still learning the process. [REDACTED] said that Jason gave up trying to connect to the Uber site and said he will drive them to the Beer Exchange. [REDACTED] said while on Uber, the patron is able to watch a map on their phone and see where the Uber is driving and the final destination to verify the driver is taking them to the correct location. [REDACTED] told me that the site never showed Jason as arriving and he received a few more emails from the Uber application telling him that Jason was on his way to pick them up while they were already driving to the bar.

In speaking with all 3 witnesses, [REDACTED]. All said that Jason was obviously inexperienced in operating the Uber application but he was friendly and never appeared agitated at all during their encounter. They said that Jason did not speak much during the drive but did ask them if they had been to the Beer Exchange in the past and how they liked it. They said that Jason did not appear intoxicated or on any drugs at all as far as they noticed. When Jason dropped them off at the Beer Exchange he drove away and that was the end of their communication. [REDACTED] told me they gave Jason no money as a "no money exchange" is the reason he likes to use Uber as the tip is included in the fare and his credit card is charged. [REDACTED] told me he checked his credit card and he was not charged for the fare as it never appeared to have connected to the web site but he was charged a \$5 cancellation fee by Uber as they believed he never accepted the fare.

I explained to [REDACTED] that it was possible that they may be contacted in the near future about this case. [REDACTED] are both from New York and [REDACTED] is from Ontario Canada, they are all friends of each other.

[REDACTED] me a copy of the confirmation from Uber at 9:21pm last night of the request for a ride and the confirmation having Jason as

#### ADDITONAL INFORMATION:

On 02-21-16, at 4:30pm I met with Sgt. Jim Dunlop of the Kalamazoo County Sheriff Dept. He had searched Mr. Dalton's vehicle and advised he did not locate any ammunition or anything else of note inside the car. We discussed this at length and believed it would be worth while for officers to search the area from when Dep. Harrison first located Mr. Dalton driving until the area he was stopped and arrested. I met with Sgt. Guilds and Mayo and asked them to put a team of officers together and search the area from the Up and Under bar at 711 W, Michigan to the Wild Bull tavern at 139 S. Edwards St. then to Shakespeares Pub at 241 E. Kalamazoo and then over to the area of Ransom and Porter St. where Mr. Dalton was stopped and arrested. They advised they would gather officers and check these areas for any property.

[REDACTED] told me that when he left the brewery, he got an Uber because he did not feel it was safe to be walking while there was an active shooter. [REDACTED] said the Uber vehicle arrived to pick him up and he remembered it as a dark colored HHR with a dark interior. [REDACTED] said he sat in the front seat and his wife and other family sat in the back seat. [REDACTED] reported to me that one of the backseat passengers said to Dalton that there was an active shooter situation. At this point, [REDACTED] asked Dalton if he was the shooter. [REDACTED] said Dalton said he was not the shooter. [REDACTED] then asked Dalton if he was sure about not being the shooter. Dalton responded to [REDACTED] by saying, "I'm just tired." [REDACTED] said he was completely joking with Dalton because he never would have imagined that an Uber driver would actually be the suspect in the shootings. [REDACTED] said that the Uber ride lasted from 0012 hours until 0019 hours on 2-21-2016 and Dalton dropped him and the passengers off at the Radisson Hotel. [REDACTED] said Dalton was quiet in the car, but thought that was simply because Dalton was tired. [REDACTED] said the Uber ride did not seem unusual. [REDACTED] said Dalton did not seem as if he were under the influence of alcohol or drugs. [REDACTED] also said that the car did not have anything unusual or suspicious looking in it.

[REDACTED] advised that it was not until he woke up on 2-21-2016 and saw the news that he realized the Uber driver that had given him and his family a ride to the Radisson was actually Dalton. [REDACTED] also told me that he did not know what kind of car the suspect was driving at the time he got an Uber ride from Dalton.

I arrived to E Ransom St west of Walbridge and observed a black Chevrolet HHR parked facing east along the south side of E Ransom St. I positioned my vehicle blocking westbound traffic on E Ransom St at Walbridge. I was called at home by CID command requesting that I come into work and assist with an investigation into two subjects that had been shot and killed at Seelye Ford on Stadium Dr.

When I arrived I was briefed that there had also be a shooting on the east side of Kalamazoo in the Sheriff Department's jurisdiction several hours earlier and a shooting at the Cracker Barrel Restaurant that happens minutes after the shooting at Seelye Ford that may involve the same suspect. I was told there were two different vehicles being driven by the shooter, but the shooter's basic description was about the same. I was also told that all of the shootings appeared to be just random with a motive.

After briefing I was told to interview two witnesses that just happen to be driving by Seelye Ford on Stadium and saw the two subjects get shot.

The two witnesses were identified as [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. The [REDACTED] stated that they were married and had just left the [REDACTED] Auditorium after watching a show. [REDACTED] stated she was the passenger and actually saw the shooting happen.

INTERVIEW of [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] A stated they were west bound on Stadium drive in the northern most lane going by Seelye Ford when she heard what she thought at first were fire crackers but then she looks to her right and can see a subject holding a black hand with both his hands pointing it at two subjects and can see the two subject fall to the ground and smoke coming out of the gun. [REDACTED] she is sure that the subject is shooting the other two subjects because she can see them fall to the ground and then the shooter stands over the subjects and shoots them a few more times.

[REDACTED] stated that the shooter was wearing dark colored clothing and she never really saw his face so she doesn't think she could identify the subject again. [REDACTED] describes the shooter as a white male with either blond or grey hair. [REDACTED] stated the hair didn't appear to be real long but did to be very thick like he had a lot of hair. [REDACTED] stated the shooter appeared to be in his mid-forties or early fifties wearing dark clothing and no hat.

[REDACTED] stated that the victims appeared to be white males also but she didn't see them very long because they fell directly to the ground after being shot. [REDACTED] stated she told her husband [REDACTED] pull over so they could watch and see what happened. [REDACTED] stated that her husband [REDACTED] pulled into the Burger King restaurant just a little ways west of Seelye Ford and called 911. [REDACTED] stated that her husband [REDACTED] a video of the shooters vehicle leaving the parking lot and going west on Stadium drive. That video had already been turned over to our department before I met with [REDACTED].

[REDACTED] stated she obviously could not hear what was being said between the shooter and the victims, but she is 100% sure she saw the shooter holding a black hand gun pointing the gun at the two victims. [REDACTED] says she can hear the shots and see the victims fall. [REDACTED] described the vehicle that saw leaving after the shooting as a small dark SUV. [REDACTED] wanted to make sure that I knew that she didn't see the actual shooter get in the vehicle that she saw leave right after the shooting she just assumed it was the shooter.

Other family members were at the scene to help the Smiths so we left.

After the notification was given Detective Cordes, Goodell and I were assigned to help the Sheriff department conduct a search of the shooters home address at 7031 Douglas Ave. in Kalamazoo County. By the time we arrive the Sheriff department had already served the wife of the shooter the search warrant and she was leaving the scene. Detective Cordes, Goodell and I assisted with the search for several hours. Please refer to lab tech's Neldon and Thomas for what evidence was seized and taken from the home.

The Michigan State Police had executed a search warrant on Uber and obtained a list of riders that had ridden with Jason Dalton that same night.

[REDACTED] stated he was picked up at his home at [REDACTED] Ave in the Township of Kalamazoo. [REDACTED] stated the Uber driver drove him to the Main Street Pub on West Main St. by Drake Rd. [REDACTED] stated when he got there he changed his mind and asked the Uber driver to take him to the Radisson Hotel down town Kalamazoo. [REDACTED] stated that he rode in the front seat with the Uber driver and made small talk but nothing he could remember. [REDACTED] he didn't see any guns in the vehicle and the driver didn't talk about guns at all. [REDACTED] stated the Uber driver did not drive reckless or do anything that was not normal.

[REDACTED] stated he was picked up at 8:02 pm in the black HHR vehicle and probably rode with the Uber driver for about 10 to 15 minutes. [REDACTED] stated the next day he saw the news and is sure that the Uber driver he was riding with was Jason Dalton.

INTERVIEW with [REDACTED]

One of the names on the list of names was [REDACTED]. I called the phone number that was listed for [REDACTED]. I spoke with [REDACTED] who stated that she was [REDACTED] daughter and her Uber account is set up so the bill is paid by her mother's credit card that is why her mother's name showed up as being the passenger.

[REDACTED] stated that she was picked up at her apartment at [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] stated the Uber driver picked her up in a black car and drove her to the transportation center in down town Kalamazoo. [REDACTED] stated that the Uber driver did not act strange in any way. [REDACTED] said the Uber driver picked her up between 8:30 pm and 9:00pm on Saturday night. While the Uber driver was driving he was singing along to the radio that was playing. [REDACTED] stated the Uber driver did not drive fast or reckless in any way. [REDACTED] stated the next day when she saw the Uber drivers picture on TV she realized that the person that picked her up was Jason Dalton.

After I spoke with [REDACTED] the first time I spoke with other Detectives about how Uber works because I had never used it. It was explained to me that once you have the app. on your phone you can actually see where the Uber driver is coming from and the color of the vehicle so you know what they are driving and when they arrive to pick up. I called [REDACTED] back and she confirmed that she did see that the Uber driver that was coming to pick her up was driving a small black vehicle and that is what she rode in to the transportation center.

#### UBER CUSTOMER CONTACTS:

On 2/22/2016, I attended a multi-jurisdictional law enforcement briefing regarding this incident. During that meeting, I was assigned to assist with contacting UBER customers who were identified as riders in DALTONS vehicle during the dates of 2/20/2016 and 2/21/2016. I received a list of customers from MSP Det. Paul Gonyeau via email. I began by contacting the first four customers and the remainder of the list was given to Det. Ellis and Pittelkow to contact with the exception of [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] who were already contacted by Det. Cordes and PSO Palmer during the initial stages of the incident.

#### CONTACT WITH [REDACTED]

On 2/22/2016, I called [REDACTED] and arranged to meet with him at WMU Draper Hall. Det. Ellis and I went to Draper Hall and spoke with him. [REDACTED] said he scheduled the Uber for pickup under his name and it showed Jason DALTON was picking him up in the Chevy Equinox. DALTON arrived to pick [REDACTED] and two of his friends, [REDACTED], near [REDACTED] and he was to take them to The Valley I Dorm on WMU. DALTON arrived at 1204 hours on 2/21/2016 and picked them up. [REDACTED] sat in the front seat of the Equinox which is standard procedure with UBER, the paying customer sits up front. [REDACTED] DALTON was not very friendly which is unique for UBER drivers, they typically are very social and chatty. [REDACTED] said DALTON had no idea how to get to the Valley I Dorm either. [REDACTED] had to give him directions the entire time. The trip lasted 6:19 minutes and [REDACTED] paid \$4.26 for the ride. [REDACTED] said he had a weird feeling the entire ride just because DALTON seemed not friendly like other UBER drivers. I called [REDACTED]'s phone number provided by the UBER records and he answered. I confirmed he was the same [REDACTED] who rode in DALTON's uber in the morning hours of 2/20/2016. [REDACTED] lived in Troy, MI so I had to interview him over the phone.

[REDACTED] called for the UBER around 0200 and DALTON arrived in the Silver Equinox around 0207 at the Duck in Waddle Out Bar on Lake Street. I called [REDACTED] on the phone and she agreed to meet with me on 2/23/2016 at the Bigby Coffee Shop on Portage Rd near the Kalamazoo Airport. When I arrived to meet [REDACTED], she had her boyfriend, [REDACTED], who was also in the Uber with her during her ride with DALTON.

[REDACTED] called for the Uber at 0149 hours on 2/20/2016 and DALTON picked her and [REDACTED] up from the Beer Exchange and drove them to [REDACTED] St where they were dropped off. DALTON had never been [REDACTED]'s uber driver before. [REDACTED] emailed me her Uber receipt and it is attached to this report.

On 2/24/2016, I was assigned to interview [REDACTED] reference his Uber ride with DALTON on 2/20/16 at approximately 1630 hours. I called [REDACTED] on his cell phone and Det. Ellis and I met with him near his employer, Bell's Brewery in Comstock, MI. We talked in my police vehicle.

[REDACTED] told us he called for the Uber through his phone app on 2/20/16 at approximately 1630 hours and DALTON picked him up within minutes. [REDACTED] approached the driver's door and asked DALTON if he was JASON and he replied it was, [REDACTED] also recognized the vehicle he was in as the Chevy Equinox that Uber described he would be riding in. The ride started out normal, [REDACTED] was seated in the front seat of the Equinox and DALTON had a black german shepard in the rear seat. DALTON received a call on his bluetooth shortly after the ride began and [REDACTED] thought it was odd that he just left the bluetooth on so he could hear DALTON's phone conversation. [REDACTED] said he did not listen to the phone conversation closely enough to know what they were talking about but he remembered the first letter of the caller's name when it was on the screen in the vehicle was a "C." He described the callers voice as high pitched and slurred as if the person was drunk, he could not tell if it was a female, male or small child but he knew the persons tone was aggravated. That phone call was the only call DALTON received while [REDACTED] was in the Equinox.

The call lasted only a minute and DALTON told the caller he had a rider in the car and would call back once he dropped [REDACTED] off and the call ended. It was at that point that DALTON began to drive erratically and at a high rate of speed. They were on Monroe Street, northbound when DALTON drove into the oncoming traffic lane, blew the stop sign and turned westbound onto W Main Street. Traffic stopped and slowed as DALTON sped off Westbound and DALTON sideswiped a green Ford Taurus, late 90's or early 2000's model. Both vehicles were still driveable and DALTON sped off Westbound, [REDACTED] looked back at the Ford Taurus and it slowed but continued driving westbound, he did not know a description of who was driving the vehicle or how many occupants were inside.

DALTON continued at a high rate of speed westbound and blew through the light at Berkley, [REDACTED] did not know if it was red or green but DALTON did not stop. DALTON repeatedly drove across the centerline into oncoming traffic to pass traffic. DALTON blew the light at Salon St and then attempted to turn onto Nichols Rd from the far left lane going westbound and missed the turn off. DALTON drove through the median by the turn and back onto the Nichols Rd. [REDACTED] said by this time he was yelling at DALTON telling him to stop the car and let him out and DALTON was yelling at him asking him where his friends house was. DALTON turned onto Iroquois St and then slammed on the brakes and stopped the truck. DALTON yelled to [REDACTED] asking where his friends car was at and [REDACTED] jumped out of the truck and ran off on foot. The last [REDACTED] saw DALTON was when he turned the Equinox around and sped off Eastbound on Iroquois St.

[REDACTED] ran to the back of the Chevy as DALTON was taking off and got his license plate. [REDACTED] called 911 and report the erratic driving and gave dispatch the license plate, he was asked if he wanted contact from an officer but he declined.

[REDACTED] ran to his friends house on Huron which was the scheduled drop off point for the Uber ride, got into his vehicle parked there from the previous night and drove back towards the scene of the sideswiping incident with the Ford Taurus. By the time [REDACTED] arrived there, the Ford Taurus was gone. He thought it took him about 10-15 minutes to return. [REDACTED] returned home at that point to [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] prior to the phone call, DALTON was in a normal state of mind and that the dog in the back seat was just sitting in the rear seat. When DALTON began driving erratically, the dog got down onto the floor and was lying down behind the driver's seat, hiding.

MELLON emailed me a copy of his Uber receipt and it is attached to this email.

#### EXAMINATION OF FORENSIC CELLPHONE FILES:

On 2/24/2016, I examined the forensic cell phone files which MSP Det. Ganyeau had retrieved from DALTON's cell phone. I found a phone call at 1640 hours which lasted just over a minute on 2/20/16 to DALTON's phone and it was from his wife, [REDACTED] I advised all other investigators of that discovery as that was likely the person who DALTON was speaking to while [REDACTED] was in the vehicle.

I responded to Seelye on Stadium for a report of two subjects shot. Upon arrival Sgt Boyer was already on scene and stated 2 were confirmed dead. I contacted a witness that was with the victim's at the time of the shooting, I conducted a pat down of the witness and made brief contact with her. She stated the male walked from the North west and had gray hair. She did not know if he came from a building, PSO Hofer continued the interview.

#### SECURE SCENE:

PSO Brooks arrived on scene to conduct a K-9 track, PSO Nielsen and PSO Preston accompanied the K-9 while PSO Behnen and I clearing the Seelye buildings. The buildings were found to be secure and it was later reported that the suspect left in a vehicle. No other victims were located. Also radio was requested to contact Seelye for a representative to operate the camera system.

#### FURTHER:

A second shooting came out at Cracker Barrel that appeared to be related. I cleared the scene and began checking parking lots on the West side of Kalamazoo for the suspect vehicle. Information was then later spread to businesses downtown.

#### SUMMARY OF EVENT:

This report relates to the ATF Grand Rapids Field Office's response for assistance to the Kalamazoo Department of Public Safety (KDPS), regarding the mass shootings allegedly committed by JASON DALTON. Mr. DALTON works part-time as an Uber driver.

#### NARRATIVE:

1. On Saturday February 20, 2016 at about 1800, a woman was shot several times in Richland Township, Michigan. This shooting was done allegedly by Mr. DALTON as he was looking to pick up an Uber passenger. The victim survived the shooting. It is believed that during this incident Mr. DALTON used a Glock pistol, model 19, 9mm with serial number SNZ011. Apparently during the shooting this firearm malfunctioned. Also during DALTON'S escape from the scene he was involved in a traffic accident. DALTON drove to a relative's house. They were not home at the time. DALTON hid his damaged vehicle and took their vehicle along with a Taurus pistol, model PT92AF, 9mm with serial number TL180876D.
2. DALTON then went back to his residence. DALTON left the Glock pistol on a workbench in his basement gun room. Dalton took a Walther pistol, model P99, 9mm with serial number 016443 with him. Before he left he gave his wife the Taurus pistol he took from the relative's house.
3. At about 2200 hours two men (a father and his son) were shot and killed at Seelye KIA car dealership, on Stadium Dr. in Kalamazoo. Mr. DALTON is the alleged shooter in this incident. At about 2215 hours Mr. DALTON is alleged to have arrived at the Cracker Barrel restaurant located in Texas Township near the intersection of 9<sup>th</sup> St. and I-94. Mr. DALTON shot five females in the parking lot. Four of the women were killed and the fifth, a 14 year old girl was gravely injured.
4. On Sunday February 21, 2016 at about 0030, Mr. DALTON was stopped by a KDPS marked unit and was arrested without incident. On the same day, KDPS obtained a search warrant for Mr. DALTON'S residence located at 7031 Douglas Ave. in Cooper Township. Agent Semear went to the scene to assist KDPS officers in the search of the residence. The following firearms were seized from the house:
  - a. Sig Sauer, rifle, model 522, .22 caliber with serial number XA019661
  - b. Sig Sauer, pistol, model P220, .45 caliber with serial number G147760
  - c. Israel Military Industries, pistol, Uzi Eagle, .40 caliber with serial number 97317475

  - e. CMMG, Inc., rifle, model MK-4, multi-caliber, with serial number SCM-113436
  - f. A home made, AR15 type rifle with no markings.
  - g. Ithaca, shotgun, model 37, 12 gauge, with unknown serial number.
  - h. Anderson Manufacturing, rifle, model AH-15, multi-caliber, with serial number 15252509
  - i. Rock River Arms, rifle, model LAR-15, .223 caliber, with serial number KT1194237
  - j. Marlin, rifle, model 60, .22 caliber, with serial number 26434976
  - k. Japanese rifle, bolt-action, with serial number 84669
  - l. Japanese rifle, bolt-action, with serial number 67105
  - m. Stevens, shotgun, 12 gauge
  - n. Glock, pistol, model 19, 9mm with serial number SNZ001
  - o. Sig Sauer, pistol, model P226, .40 caliber with serial number U482711
5. In addition, the KDPS recovered the Walther pistol, model P99, 9mm with serial number 016443 from DALTON when he was arrested. TFO Rivard and Agent Semear worked together to send urgent trace requests on all firearms that could be traced to the ATF Firearms Tracing Center.

S/A Kitchen received an email from [REDACTED] detailing that the above described ballistic vest was manufactured in 1997 at their Oakland Park, Florida facility that has been closed for 10 years now. ## Notes/Narratives

### NARRATIVE

#### SUMMARY:

On 2-20-16 I responded to the Cracker Barrel restaurant on 9th St for the report of people being shot. It was believed this to be related to other shootings, one of which had just occurred at the Seelye Kia dealership. On scene I assisted in providing first aid to victims.

#### ARRIVAL ON SCENE:

I arrived behind PSO Brooks and PSO Preston. I could see that one vehicle had broken glass on the passenger side front door. I could other units saying that some of the people in the vehicles were dead. I went over to the Chevy Cobalt to help assess casualties.

#### OBSERVATIONS:

I could see a KCSO deputy rendering aid to an elderly female in the back seat, passenger side. A second elderly female was in the back seat, driver's side was leaned against her. I could see that her eyes were fixed and when I checked her for a pulse I couldn't find any. I observed what appeared to be a gunshot wound to the front of the neck. From the lack of vital signs, no pulse, and the injury, I presumed her dead. I then heard the female on the passenger side back seat trying to speak to the deputy but could also hear wet breathing. I illuminated the front seat with my flashlight and could see a small body slouched very low in the front passenger seat. The driver of the vehicle was hunched over on top the them.

I hurried to the other side of the vehicle, opened the front passenger door, and saw a young female who was breathing but not responsive. First aid in the position she was at in the seat was not possible so I removed her from the seat and laid her on the asphalt next to the vehicle. I observed what appeared to be a gunshot wound to the left side of her head at her hairline. The wound was actively bleeding and oozing fluid.

#### MEDICAL TREATMENT:

I began cutting and removing the female's shirt to check for other wounds and did not find any. I checked responsiveness by speaking to the female and then using a sternum rub. There was no response from the female but she continued to breath. I used a large dressing to cover her wound and secured it with the attached bandage. I requested a paramedic try inserting a oropharyngeal airway to keep a good airway but the female kept biting on the device.

Since the wound was bandaged I did not believe there to be anything else officers and paramedics could provide on scene and loaded the female onto a stretcher and requested Pride Care transport her directly to Bronson Hospital for treatment.

As we were loading her into the ambulance, the female did start moving her right arm appearing to try covering her chest. I again tried getting a response from the female by speaking to her but she did not respond.

#### ADDITIONAL INFORAMTION:

After the victims were transported, I used police tape to cordon off the area for evidence.

#### DVR:

My DVR was functional and activated during this incident.

### Supplement Notes

#### SUMMARY:

On February 20, 2016 I responded to Cracker Barrel restaurant after hearing of shots fired and possible victims on the ground. I was the second officer on scene behind MSP and observed two vehicles that appeared to have several broken windows and multiple injured people inside. I began checking for pulses of the occupants of the vehicles and seeing if medical aid could be rendered. Once other officers began to arrive I directed them to try and find witnesses and begin blocking off the area to avoid contamination.

#### SCENE:

The scene of the incident was 5581 9th St, Cracker Barrel restaurant.

#### DISPATCH:

Prior to this call KDPS was dispatched to 4201 Stadium Drive for the report of a double homicide in the parking lot. The suspect vehicle was seen leaving was a dark colored vehicle leaving west bound on Stadium Dr.

#### INFORMATION:

I have been a Public Safety Officer for over 12 years. During this time I have been trained as a relief lab technician. My duties as a relief lab technician are to process crime scenes. I have assisted in or processed several hundred crime scenes of many different types to include homicide scenes.

#### ARRIVAL:

As I pulled into the parking lot I could see an MSP trooper trying to make contact with the rear seat passenger side of a small red car in the parking lot. I then went and tried to make contact with the other occupants.

#### MEDICAL AID:

I began in the back seat driver's side of the small red car and started checking for a pulse of the female. I could see multiple bullet entry wounds to her through her clothing. She was unresponsive, not breathing, and lifeless.

I then checked the driver of the small red car. The driver, another female was also unresponsive, not breathing, and lifeless. The driver had blood all over her face and body, but I could not see any visible bullet entry wounds.

Next I moved to a minivan next to the small red car. I could see that the driver's front window and rear passenger window were smashed out and there was a single occupant in the vehicle. I tried to get a pulse and any sort of response from the driver and again she was unresponsive, not breathing, and lifeless.

It was at this point that PSO Nielsen located a small female in the front passenger seat of the small red car. He and I removed the female and could see that she had extensive injuries. PSO Nielsen began checking for the extent of injuries while I grabbed a medical bag. We began to render aid to the female as the paramedics and additional units were arriving. I then directed the ambulance in and we quickly loaded the small female into the first ambulance. After she was loaded we loaded an elderly female that the trooper was originally talking with into the second ambulance.

I then retrieved my evidence collection kit from my patrol car and began marking the shell casings that I could see on the ground. After the shell casings were located and marked MSP command advised that their crime lab was in route to process the scene. I then picked up the rest of my evidence kit and collected my gear.

#### ADDITIONAL:

After checking with command I then cleared and returned to the city of Kalamazoo.

#### INFORMATION:

On 02/20/2016, at approximately 2224 hrs, I responded to 5581 South 9th Street, the Cracker Barrel Old Country Store, in reference to a possible gunshot victim. After arriving on scene I assisted in the preliminary investigation which was later turned over to the Michigan State Police.

#### PRIOR INFORMATION:

On 02/20/2016, at approximately 2208 hrs, several officers were dispatched to 4102 Stadium Drive, Seelye Kia, in reference to a possible gunshot victim. Upon officers arrival two homicide victims were located. During this investigation I assisted with a K9 track and later cleared by command to respond to 5581 South 9th Street.

#### ARRIVAL:

Upon my arrival at least one MSP trooper was on scene. I arrived on scene shortly after PSO Brooks. Initially I ensured that the scene was safe and that the suspect(s) had fled. I noted officers up to the two vehicles parked in the parking lot. Both vehicles appeared to have been shot. One of the involved vehicles was a tan Oldsmobile and the other involved vehicle was a red Chevy Cruz. Officers were checking on the welfare of the occupants as I asked store employees to review the video surveillance cameras and attempt to locate additional witnesses. I noted two male subjects to be standing nearby. These individuals were later interviewed by other officers. It should be noted that I did not gather their information.

#### MEDICAL TREATMENT:

I was informed that there were victims inside of the vehicles and asked for an additional ambulance to respond. Soon after my arrival members of the KCSD, MSP, and WMUPD arrived. MSP then took over the investigation.

#### ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

I was relieved from my duties by MSP troopers and was provided their case number as 51-740-16.

#### DVR:

DVR from vehicle 1193 was used.

### INFORMATION SUMMARY:

On February 20, 2016 at approximately 1800 hours I was contacted by Lt. Misner by phone while enroute to work. He received a request from KCSD for lab assistance reference to a shooting investigation. KCSD was advised that I was responding to work and would be delayed. When I arrived at work I made contact with KCSD dispatch. They made contact with Sgt Beuckelaere who was scene command and he requested that I still respond. I was advised that a female was shot several times by an unknown person in a vehicle. On arrival I made contact with Sgt Beuckelaere who debriefed me on what occurred. We conducted a scene walk thru to determine what evidence was found and what needed to be processed. I was advised Sgt Dunlop was also responding to the scene and he arrived shortly after I arrived.

### SCENE:

The incident occurred at 5111 Highmeadows Drive, which is within the Meadows Townhomes complex located in the township of Richland, County of Kalamazoo, Michigan.

## Notes/Narratives

Highmeadows Drive is a large loop that is accessible from Meadows Blvd. Highmeadows Drive has a south, east and north section. 5111 Highmeadows Drive is located on the east section. This building is located on the west side roadway and is the only building on the west side. At the north end of 5111 Highmeadows Drive is an open area with grass and a playground.

The incident occurred outside in front of apartment 'H'. Apartment 'H' is located on the north end of the building.

### SCENE EXAMINATION:

I observed ten (10) casings in the parking lot in the area in front of 5111 Highmeadows Drive, apartment 'H'. In front of apartment 'H' in the first parking spot from the north I observed a maroon colored F-150 truck that was back into the parking spot. The casings were found in front and north of the truck. On the parking lot just north of the truck I observed acceleration tire marks. I received information that the suspect fled the scene at a high rate of speed after the shooting. The acceleration marks were photographed and measured. The tire tracks were also marked with orange pavement paint. Track width measurements were as follows:

-Outer to outer: 5 feet, 8 inches

-Inner to inner: 4 feet, 7.5 inches

The tread detail was insufficient for examination, but I was able to determine that there were five rows of tread blocks and in the center row there appeared to be a line.

The casings in the parking lot were marked with yellow evidence placards and photographed prior to collection. The casings were as follows:

-Item #1: Found in between acceleration marks, north of the Ford truck

-Item #2: Found in between acceleration marks, north of the Ford truck

-Item #3: Found in between acceleration marks at beginning of tire mark

-Item #4: Found in between acceleration marks at beginning of tire mark

-Item #5: Found near left front tire of Ford truck

-Item #6: Found near left front tire of Ford truck

-Item #7: Found in front of Ford truck

-Item #8: Found in front of Ford truck

-Item #9: Found in front of Ford truck near right front tire

-Item #10: Found under Ford truck near front tires

The truck had visible impact damage to the driver's side. It appeared that there were two impacts on the driver's door. The first impact was near the front door hinge and the second was just below the driver's door handle. The damage was photographed.

On the driver's side of the vehicle near the rear tire I observed clothing. I was advised that this was the clothing from the victim. The clothing found was a pair of black boots, jeans, black shirt and pink jacket. The jeans, shirt and jacket had visible blood present. The parking lot in this area also had blood present. The clothing was marked with yellow evidence placard #11. The concrete curb where the clothing was found had two locations where the concrete appeared to have spalled. This may have been areas where bullets may have impacted. The damage was photographed. The grass directly west of the clothing in front of apartment 'H' had visible impacts. These impact sites were photographed. See Sgt Dunlop's report for further examination details.

The building directly west of the Ford truck, clothing and casings (#3-#10) had impact damage. The impact damage sites were marked with scales as E-1 thru E-7 by Sgt Dunlop and were photographed. Several of the bullets that impacted the siding perforated the interior OSB and drywall and impacted the wall on the opposite side of the service closet. See Sgt Dunlop's report for further details. The damage inside the service closet was photographed. In the landscape bark at the base of the impact damage (E-4/E-5) a bullet was found. The bullet was marked with yellow evidence placard #12.

#### BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

On 2/20/16 I was contacted by Specialist Bombich and advised of two homicides that had occurred at 4102 Stadium Dr., Seelye Kia of Kalamazoo. Specialist Bombich asked if I could respond to assist Technician Neldon in processing the scene. Specialist Bombich advised Kalamazoo County Sherriff Department has three or four homicides at 5581 Cracker Barrel Blvd., Cracker Barrel restaurant and they may be related. Specialist Bombich advised he would be responding to 4102 Stadium Dr, to assist Technician Neldon.

I responded to Kalamazoo Public Safety Headquarters to gather equipment and responded to the scene with Specialist Bombich and Technician Denharder. We responded to the scene at approximately 2330 hours and made contact with Technician Neldon and Sgt. Boyer who were on scene.

I was assigned to assist with scene documentation with the use of electronic mapping equipment. I was later assigned to search the south side of Stadium Drive at 3939 Stadium Drive, Zeigler Chrysler - Dodge - Ram dealership for possible evidence or damage to vehicles in the lot.

I was assigned to assist Technician Neldon on a search warrant at 7031 Douglas Avenue, the home of Jason Dalton. KCSD Det/Sgt Baker secured a search warrant for the home and property at 7031 Douglas Avenue.

#### SCENE:

The scene is 4102 Stadium Drive, Seelye Kia of Kalamazoo. 4102 Stadium Drive is located on the north side of Stadium Drive east of Seneca Drive in the City of Kalamazoo, County of Kalamazoo, and State of Michigan.

Upon arrival on scene I observed the entrance east of Seelye Kia of Kalamazoo was cordoned off by yellow police tape that stretched west along the sidewalk to the Kia sign post. The tape was stretched north to the front door of 4102 Stadium Drive. I observed yellow police tape across the Kia lot west of the east driveway. The tape was located between the first light pole near the sidewalk to the light pole north of the lot, then looped to the west ending at the southeast corner of 4102 Stadium Drive.

I observed two male subjects lying on the ground near the Seelye Auto Group New & Used Auto sign with white sheets covering them. I observed a gray Range Rover vehicle with flashers activated west of the two males.

#### SCENE MAPPING:

I assisted Specialist Bombich and Technician Denharder with the scene documentation using a scene total station. I operated the stationary device as the scene was mapped with measurements of items contained in the scene.

#### SCENE SEARCH:

I was assigned 3939 Stadium Drive, Zeigler Chrysler - Dodge - Ram dealership to inspect the parking lot, vehicles and building for damage and possible evidence from the incident at 4102 Stadium Drive. I assisted in inspecting the vehicles that were facing north towards Stadium Drive. I did not locate any damage in the lot, vehicles or building. I did not locate anything of evidentiary value at 3939 Stadium Drive in the lot.

#### SEARCH WARRANT EXECUTION:

A search warrant was executed at 7031 Douglas Avenue, Jason Dalton residence on 2/21/16. 7031 Douglas Avenue is a tan single story house with white trim facing east on Douglas Avenue. 7031 Douglas Avenue is located on the northwest corner of Douglas Avenue and West E Avenue. 7031 Douglas Avenue is located in Cooper Township, County of Kalamazoo, State of Michigan.

Technician Neldon and I arrived on scene at approximately 0330 hours and made contact with KDPS detectives on scene. KDPS detectives, Cordes, Goodell and Pittelkow assisted in the search of the property. I was assigned the main level of the house and exterior at the property.

The main level of the house consisted of a living room, dining area, kitchen, family room, three bedrooms and two bathrooms. Evidence items were located in the family room, kitchen, three bedrooms, hallway closet and the living room. The evidence items seized from the main level were secured and turned over to Technician Neldon.

The exterior of the house was searched including an attached garage, unattached garage and a small shed. Upon searching the backyard along the south side of the attached garage I observed several shotgun shell casings on the ground. The casings were near a small plastic storage shed that has damage consistent with several large projectiles being shot through it from the north side.

Upon a closer inspection of the shed the projectiles exited through the south side of the shed and through stockade fencing south of the shed. The yard outside of the fence was searched along with the curb lawn and street south of the fence for possible projectiles. No projectiles were located in the yard or street. The casings were photographed and seized as evidence.

The unattached garage north of the house was searched with no additional evidence obtained.

Upon completion of executing the search warrant, a copy of the warrant and search warrant tabulation were left in the house and the house was secured at 0855 hours on 2/21/16.
